LANDSBERG, Germany, May 27 (AP)—Twenty-two guards and foremen at the Nazi Mauthausen concentration camp died on blackened gallows here today in the yard of the prison where Adolf Hitler once brooded as a prisoner and wrote "Mein Kampf". Twenty-seven more, including an Austrian gaoler, are to be hanged by United States soldiers tomorrow.

Opposition Parties Unite Against Gov't

OTTAWA, May 27—(CP)—Opposition motions calling for votes of non-confidence in the Government because of the budget brought down a month ago were defeated tonight in the Commons. By a vote of 109 to 91 the members rejected a C. C. F. motion which called on the House to express regret that the budget had not provided for increases in basic income tax exemptions and had provided no relief for the half of the Canadian population which does not earn enough to pay income taxes.

N. B. Names Air Cadets For Tour Of England

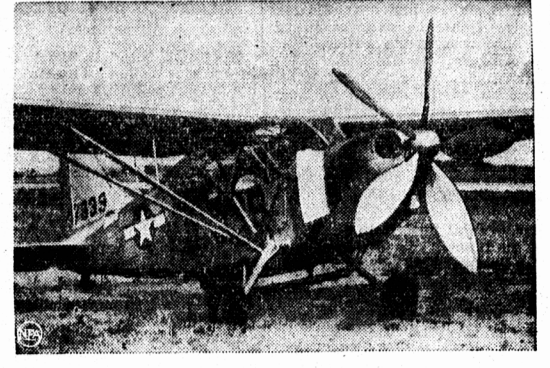

4171 Motor Vehicles Bought In April

OTTAWA, May 27—(CP)—Financing of motor vehicles rose in April to 4171 new vehicles involving \$3,784,528, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today. The previous month, 3461 were financed for \$4,582,846 while in April last year 2,340 vehicles were financed to the extent of \$2,574,123.

Queen's To Remain Dual Constituency

OTTAWA, May 27—(CP)—The Commons committee on redistribution decided today not to make any change in the boundaries of the dual constituency of Queen's in Prince Edward Island. The committee at previous meetings had heard a suggestion that the constituency be split into separate seats to abolish the confusion arising in cases where two men are elected for the one seat.
