Exhausted Coal Miners Call Off Strike

PECS, Hungary, Feb. 1.—Hunger and cold put an end to the second "suicide strike" in recent months today, and 625 exhausted coal miners came up from the pits after 35 hours under ground to announce they would negotiate with the mine owners.

Reports said the latter were prepared to grant an increase in salaries of 10 percent in an effort to forestall further labor troubles.

Earlier in the day 73 of the 608 miners who plunged into the pits yesterday came out, and the remaining 625 emerged at 2:30 p.m., bringing with them 40 Socialist miners they had held as hostages.

FLEMINGTON, N. J., Feb. 1.—The Lindbergh baby kidnaping mystery was thrust tonight on the trail of Violet Sharpe, servant in the Dwight W. Morrow household who committed suicide after the kidnaping, and Isador Fisch, and furrier friend of Bruno Richard Hauptmann during the electric chair as the kidnapper.

Peter H. Sommer, a New York fingerprint expert, testified that March 1, 1932, the night of the kidnaping, he travelled on a ferry from New Jersey to New York City with two men whom he saw assist a nervous woman with a blond baby toward a street car on the New York side.

Is Designed To Create Easier Farm Credits

Extension Of Benefits Of Canadian Farm Loan Act To All Provinces Is Proposed.

(Canadian Press, by Guardian's Special Wire)
OTTAWA, Feb. 1.—A government bill designed to create easier farm credit was explained to the House of Commons today by Finance Minister E. N. Rhodes. It would overhaul the Canadian Farm Loan Act, extending it to all provinces, eliminate provincial boards and increase the available loan money from \$15,000,000 to \$90,000,000.

The three provinces which would come under the Act for the first time are Ontario, Saskatchewan and Prince Edward Island. This would enable centralization of authority, and remove the charges of "passing the buck" between the Dominion and provincial boards which existed in the past.

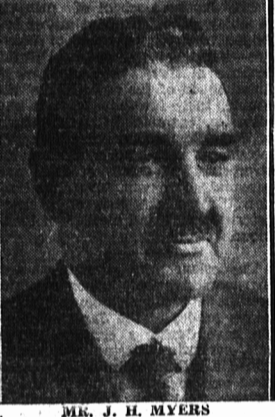
