THE PRISONER PALMER.

It is observed that the prisoner Henry Palmer, against whom some suspicion is held in regard to the murder of Dr. Warburton, had been removed from that institution to the natic Hospital.

So far all seems to have been regular enough, but circumstances of his release from the institution for the insane were distinctly irregular, to put it mildly. We are informed that in the absence of Superintendent Goodwill, Dr. James Warburton, the acting Superintendent, released Palmer as a cured patient.

Whether it is in the power of an acting Superintendent when just entering upon his duties to thus liberate a patient, over whom his personal observations must have been very brief may be a matter which intelligent persons will differ.

But it seems clear that neither Dr. Goodwill, the Superintendent, had been there, nor Dr. Warburton in the Superintendent's absence, had power to liberate the patient as he did. If Palmer was cured of his insanity, law required that he should have returned to jail. Dr. Warburton's error was in treating a convicted offender with an unexpired sentence, precisely as he would have treated an ordinary sane patient who had been taken from home to the Asylum, and there been cured.

Palmer was released before the murder occurred. We are bound to assume until the contrary is proved that he is innocent of that crime, but in no way alters the fact that by some person's error or wrongful action he was turned loose upon the community where the law required that he should have been in jail. If the prisoner is innocent he being in jail would have prevented suspicion resting upon him. So that if innocent, the prisoner suffers from his wrongful discharge. If by any chance Palmer could yet be proven to be the guilty party, then we must remember that had the law been carried out the murder would not have been committed. Thus the episode is in every respect an awkward one.

BANQUET TO MR BLAIR,

Mr. Blair is to be banqueted in the biggest hotel of the biggest city in Canada. And it is to be the biggest banquet that ever was, to which special trains will bring the guests from east west and north and south. The great event will come after the elections, and utterly regardless of whether Grit or Tory wins. What is an election, any way? But a banquet is banquet.

Mr. Blair is entitled to this banquet in his honor. There is no more forceful man in the public life of Canada today than he, and that is saying much. When he resigned his seat in the Cabinet and gave up \$8,000 a year to make his great speech against the Grand Trunk Pacific he was true to his honest convictions. When he resigned the Chairmanship of the Railway Commission and \$10,000 a year to reaffirm his opposition we doubt not he was still true to his convictions.

Mr. Blair's opponents and critics will tell us that he is often arbitrary, sometimes vindictive, sometimes egotistical. And if so, what then? There are spots on the sun, even while it gives warmth and light to the entire solar system. What chiefly concerns us is that our public men shall be strong, capable, incorruptible and shall pursue a faithful public course. Search and find if you can another public man in who has sacrificed more to his convictions than Andrew G. Blair. We venture the prediction that the banquet in his honor will be a great national tribute to a not a public man, who dared, at whatever cost, to say the thing he believes.

APPLE SHIPMENTS.

OTTAWA, Ont., Oct. 24.—English importers of Canadian apples are strongly protesting against the shipments going by New York. The rate to Glasgow is sixpence a barrel less than by Canadian lines but owing to the lack of cold storage or proper ventilation on American steamships there is a difference of two shillings a barrel in the market in favor of apples by direct shipment.

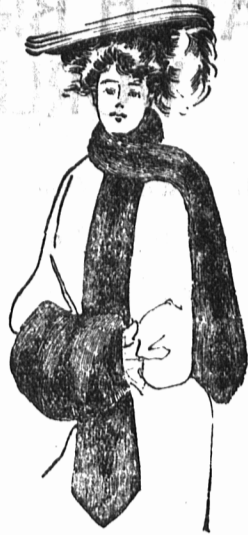
