Produce Prices

NEW YORK, Sept. 26 (AP)—The stock market displayed a little better balance today after yesterday's relapse but the list as a whole was unable to do much on the recovery side.

Canadian stocks were drags with few active issues ranging slightly higher. Distillers Seagram gained 1/4. International Nickel and Imperial Oil 1/2 point each. Walkers common lost 1/4 and preferred 3/4 while Brazilian Traction and Ford both were unchanged.

The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 2 of a point at 42.8. Of 721 stocks traded 298 were up and 418 unchanged. Transfers amounted to 486,380 shares compared with 1,169,090 the day before when prices were suffering one of their worst slumps of the year to date.

Recessions of fractions to a point or so were recorded by General Motors, Chrysler, Montgomery Ward, American Telephone, Consolidated Aircraft, Consolidated Aircraft, Du Pont, Westinghouse, American Can, Pepsi-Cola, American Smelting and J. C. Penney.

Finishing with modest advances were Santa Fe, N. Y. Central, Great Northern, Kennecott, Cerro de Pasco, Western Union, Consolidated Edison, General Electric, Philip Morris, Douglas Aircraft, Lockheed and Texas Corp.

Finance

NEW YORK, Sept. 26 (AP)—Broad buying, reflecting the scantiness of immediate supplies in Cuba, pushed world sugar futures 2 to 8 points higher today on a turnover of 29,550 tons.

Domestic contracts advanced 4 to 8 points on trade covering in expectation of a reduction in the import duty on Cuban raw sugar. Sales 2,000 tons.

Both the raw and refined markets remained unchanged.

World contract, close: Dec. 2.40B; Jan. 2.40B; March 2.28B; May 2.28; July 2.28B. Domestic contract: Jan. 2.88B; March 2.85B; May 2.87B.

Grain

WINNIPEG, Sept. 26 (CP)—Remained unchanged. Exports of the Prairie grain belt brought buyers into the market on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today and all futures prices scored gains. Liberal offerings on upturns prevented wheat futures prices from making wide advances but they closed 1/2 higher, October 72 3/4, December 74 1/4 and May 79 3/4 cents a bushel.

Buenos Aires values remained nudged unchanged levels.

CHICAGO, Sept. 26 (AP)—After registering gains of about a cent a bushel or more, wheat and other grain prices backed down today losing most of the advance.

Wheat closed 1/2 higher, Dec 1.21 3/4, May 1.26-1.26 1/2; corn 1/4 up, Dec 81 1/4, May 87 1/4; oats 1/4 higher, rye 1/4 of 1 up; soybeans unchanged to 1/4 higher.

Currencies

NEW YORK, Sept. 26 (CP)—The Canadian dollar, finished 1/4 cent higher in today's drags foreign exchange dealings at a discount of 1 1/2 per cent in relation to United States currency. Ottawa foreign exchange control board rate, 90.919, per cent discount. The pound sterling followed a usual pattern, holding a 1/4-cent gain most of the day only to close unchanged at 403 1/4.

Next Tuesday will be the last opportunity to pay your 1941 Income Tax on the Government Monthly Plan. This gives you the privilege of paying in twelve monthly installments without interest, instead of by lump sum in March, 1942.

Here is how to get the monthly payment privilege! Divide the total of your 1940 Income Tax by twelve. This is your first payment—and must be paid to the Receiver General on or before September 30, 1941. You will then pay the same amount before the end of each month for the balance of 1941. When you have estimated your 1941 income tax at the 1941 rate, you will deduct the four payments you will have already made, and pay the remainder in eight equal monthly installments, starting January, 1942.

The Government offers the above plan as the most reasonable and convenient method of meeting income tax obligations. Ask your local Income Tax Office for Installment Income Tax Remittance Form—and any further information you may require.
