Met in "Slave" Camp Are Wed in Timmins



Reunited six weeks ago after first meeting in a Nazi displaced person camp, Milvi Sammakivi, an Estonian, and Artura Anolins, a Latvian, were married at Timmins, Ont.

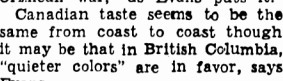

New Disposal Plant Aids Sewage Problem

TORONTO, Sept. 27 - (CP) - A new multi-million-dollar sewage disposal plant on Toronto's eastern outskirts which will go into partial operation next year is expected to end many of the city's sewage troubles.

For some time raw sewage has been emptied into Lake Ontario only a few miles from the intakes that supply the city with drinking water; the city's eastern beaches have not been free from pollution for more than 20 years, and uncovered sludge beds have made life hard for citizens when an east wind blows.

Originally scheduled for completion in three years, the first two stages in constructing the huge plant took six years. It took 36 months to build a pair of sluice gates, and even lake locks couldn't be delivered for 16 months.
