Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any joint over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency, but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

The results of the cow testing work carried on during the past year by the late Geo. Burgess and C. J. Cook Dairy Branch to take up the work after Mr. Burgess' death, and compiling over 350 pounds of butter-fat. The figures are furnished by Mr. Cooke Dairymen's Association.

Table with columns: Name of Owner, Residence, Breed, Lbs. Milk, Lbs. Fat. Lists various cow owners and their production statistics.

The order of arrangement is of yield of butter fat, although it is obvious to any farmer that skim milk has considerable value and therefore a cow with less fat but greater weight of milk may be the more economical producer. The leading cows milked realized a value of \$200.00. At present prices with butter at 44 cts. per lb., and skim milk at 40 cts. per lb., her milk would be worth \$278.60.

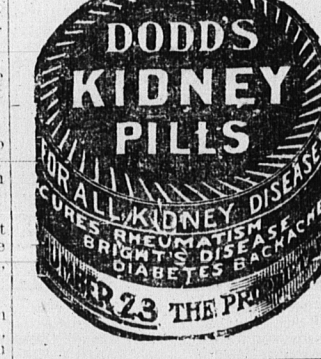
