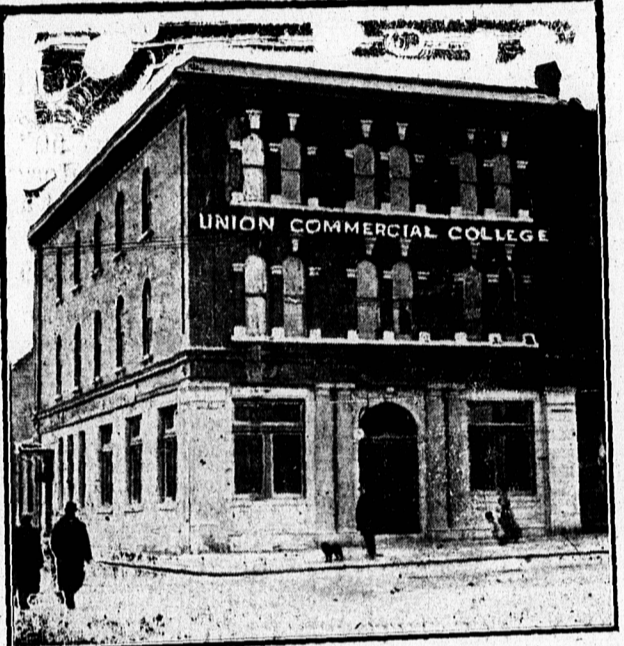

Government Aid Feed

reduced freights on the government R. R. and winter boats and sold it to the farmers towards the spring at COST.

Mr. Len says, "We try to show proper appreciation of the many forms of advice that are tendered us from time to time" so I will take him at his word this time and venture to add to Mr. McCarthy's advice that if the department have any good business reasons why they should delay in carrying out the advice I am sure your readers would like to know them.

My proposition is this. Let the commissioner of agriculture send his men through the island inspecting and buying up all the hay that is for sale at the present time and get options on what hay farmers have to spare who can afford to hold it in the hopes of getting higher prices. Then when this is done, advertise how much there is to dispose of and ration it out to bonafide farmers that are actually in need of the hay, or will be before the next grass.

I will go further than Mr. McCarthy and say that to carry our cattle through, we will have to feed practically all the straw we have, and it should likewise be bought up at its feeding value, but in any case we must all feed straw and that means that we must buy concentrated such as bran and oil cake.

Now, what the government should do if they have not already done so, is to get in touch with the large dealers in the west and get prices on ten or twenty cars of this feed and bring it to the Island and sell it to the farmers at the COST for cash plus 5 percent if bought on time, with a lien note on the farmers stock which is to be paid by either the hay or the imported feeds.

By buying in such large quantities the government could get a much finer price than even our largest wholesalers, and if they do not want to compete with the merchants, let them pay them five cents a bag for their trouble, and as the hay would be hauled direct from the west, this would pay them well. The department could ascertain how much bran and oil cake is different farmers would want in a short time, and could order almost at once, for there is no time to be lost if, as the commissioner says, Quebec and eastern Ontario are much worse off than we are in the matter of feed for it is supply and demand that rules prices and with these conditions, feed is sure to advance.

Carl Akeley, of the American Museum of Natural History, describes an elephant's trunk as follows in the World's Work:

There is nothing else like an elephant's trunk on earth.
