THE LESSONS OF THE VISIT.

Our distinguished visitors have come and gone. Their passing call at our Island shores was all too brief, but short as it was we trust that it has left such impressions upon Lord and Lady Minto as will make them desirous of returning at a future date for a longer stay in our midst. His Excellency came among us as the official head of a great Dominion and as the representative of our honored and revered Sovereign, King Edward. He could hardly be unmindful of the fact that here he met with a people contented and happy as any in the world; proud to be members of the Dominion family and not less proud to be citizens of the greatest Empire the world has yet seen; a people loyal to their King, well satisfied with the institutions under which they live, with no wrongs to redress, no tale of grievance to lay at the foot of the Throne.

We on our part have seen in Lord and Lady Minto worthy representatives of the aristocracy of the Mother Land, and worthy successors of the noblemen whom during generations past Britain has sent to preside in our councils and administer a just and beneficent government. We have been brought for the time in closer touch with the sister Provinces having the same representative head, and also enabled to feel how real is the bond which binds us to the Empire and the King whose official representative has come amongst us. We have had further evidence if any were needed that the tie which binds together the nations of the Empire is one of justice and good will, of mutual regard and mutual respect.

"Happy is the people that is in such case,"—dwelling together in concord, under institutions of their own election and equitably administered by ministers who have their confidence; untaxed save as they tax themselves for their own good; fearing no foes without or within the Dominion; resting secure under the blessing of Heaven which has given to Britain the mastery of the sea. So far as our institutions and our national connection are concerned we could not be more happily circumstanced. It is well at such a time as that of a Viceroyal visit to recall these things with profound thankfulness for what is past or present, and to confront the future with bright hopes and a cheerful courage.

Arrivals continued at all hours last night and in the early hours of this morning, but the last belated train was in and the last tired traveller had given a warm welcome to the citizens' committee before the first number of today's program was called. The great pavilion was decorated and ready. The last tack had been driven and the last bit of color had been added in good time. The auditorium presented a pleasing sight. The entire auditorium was canopied by American flags, while around the gallery railing red and white bunting was draped gracefully, with here and there shields of America and Great Britain, while their respective flags tossed above them. The stage was hung with gold-colored bunting, the state's color. The throng began assembling early for the opening ceremonies, everyone enthusiastic and happy. From the torrid temperature of the east to the cool breezes of the Pacific and a temperature of sixty was a welcome and exhilarating change to the pilgrims if their looks and actions to-day may be taken as evidence. At 11 o'clock this morning three celebrations of the Lord's Supper were held in the First Presbyterian, Central Methodist and the Howard street Methodist churches. These meetings were purely devotional in character, but were attended by crowds that taxed the capacity of the buildings. At 10 a. m. a missionary conference was held at the headquarters on Larkin street. At the same time a business meeting of president, elders and League officials assembled at the pavilion in order to prepare for the day's activities.
