Fire Destroys McInnis' Bakery

McInnis' Bakery, 29-year-old establishment located on Granville Street was the scene of a destructive blaze early Sunday morning when a fire, believed to have originated near a small stove in the bake-shop section of the building, caused extensive damage to the premises and equipment.

The alarm, sent in by a resident of Upper Prince Street at midnight, was quickly responded to. The local fire department, despite heavy fog on the streets, had water playing on the building within ten minutes after receiving the call.

On their arrival firemen found the bake-shop ablaze with the flames eating their way up to the second floor and beginning to show through the roof on the north end of the building. However, the blaze was brought under control within twenty minutes with the all-out signal being given at 1.10. Flames were confined to the bake-shop and adjoining office with the warehouse located on the north end escaping damage.
