

REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PEOPLE. Yet, "This is the true condition of affairs in this province." "We have taxation imposed by men who were elected to carry out an opposite policy." They have tried to "quibble" over these matters and "The Leader of the government has made statements that are unworthy of him." "Nothing that is said or written in their press, unless it be set forth in a resolution moved by himself on the floor of the House" is considered as binding upon the party.

In plainer words, "He is then a free lance; when his party go to the country I suppose they are told "We want you to win the election—win it any way—make what promises you please. THEY ARE NOT BINDING IF THEY ARE NOT PUT IN THE FORM OF A RESOLUTION" before the House. It is a case of,—

Get place and wealth, if possible with grace;
If not, by any means, get wealth and place.

Can faith be placed in any body of men who formulate a policy of such a fashion and with such a class of politicians before them how can or could the people "judge or form an opinion as to what policy the government has adopted BY ANYTHING OUTLINED TO IT BY THE LEADER OF THE GOVERNMENT?" It was in this way that they "obtained power by deceiving the people of the province with false promises; they found their task an impossible one and instead of formulating a new policy and submitting it to the people they, without any mandate undertook to legislate the most intricate and most obnoxious system of taxation which we have ever experienced. "Is it any reason, then, that the people of the province are indignant or "Is it any wonder that indignation meetings have been called

Mr. Stewart considered it a great pity, that the Legislative Assembly of this province, men who have been elected to legislate in the interests of the province, should be spending perhaps one third of their time in criticising and abusing a certain branch of the public press of the province. it would have been very much more to his credit had he done so."

With regard to the only work during the past year worthy of note, that is the road improvement under the Highways Act for which they were lauding the Commissioner of Public Works up to the skies, he called their attention to the fact that this movement was inaugurated by the federal government. He further recalled their attitude towards this work before they came into power. They and their press in glaring headlines declared that, "this highway would if carried out, ruin the province and place an unbearable burden of taxation on the people." They were entitled to no thanks for this, for they were only carrying out the policy of the late government, which had been forced upon them, from plans which were "made before this government came into power and were prepared by the present leader of the opposition." But they have varied from those plans to the extent of making dust heap roads which will not be permanent, and if these roads "will require in the future the same amount of upkeep as ordinary roads, then I say the expenditure will NOT be justified." And while all this attention has been paid to this highway scheme, THE OTHER ROADS OF THE PROVINCE HAVE BEEN NEGLECTED. We advise our readers to read Mr. Stewart's speech, published in Thursday's Guardian and to preserve it for future reference.
