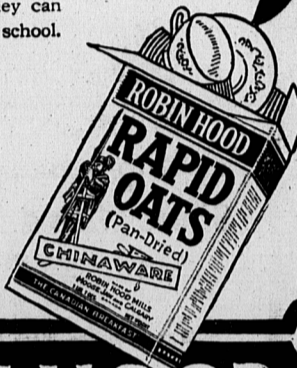

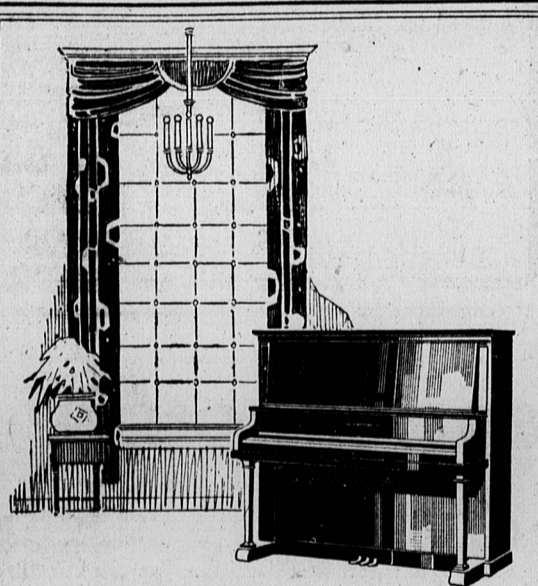

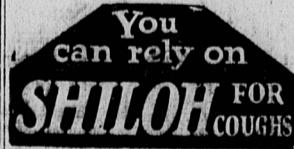

LONDON, April 14.—Plans have now been completed for the new longest non-stop rail run in the world from London to Carnforth, in Lancashire, on the Easton-St. Pancras route. The run will be 236 miles—10 miles longer than the present longest non-stop-run on the G. W. R. from London to Plymouth.

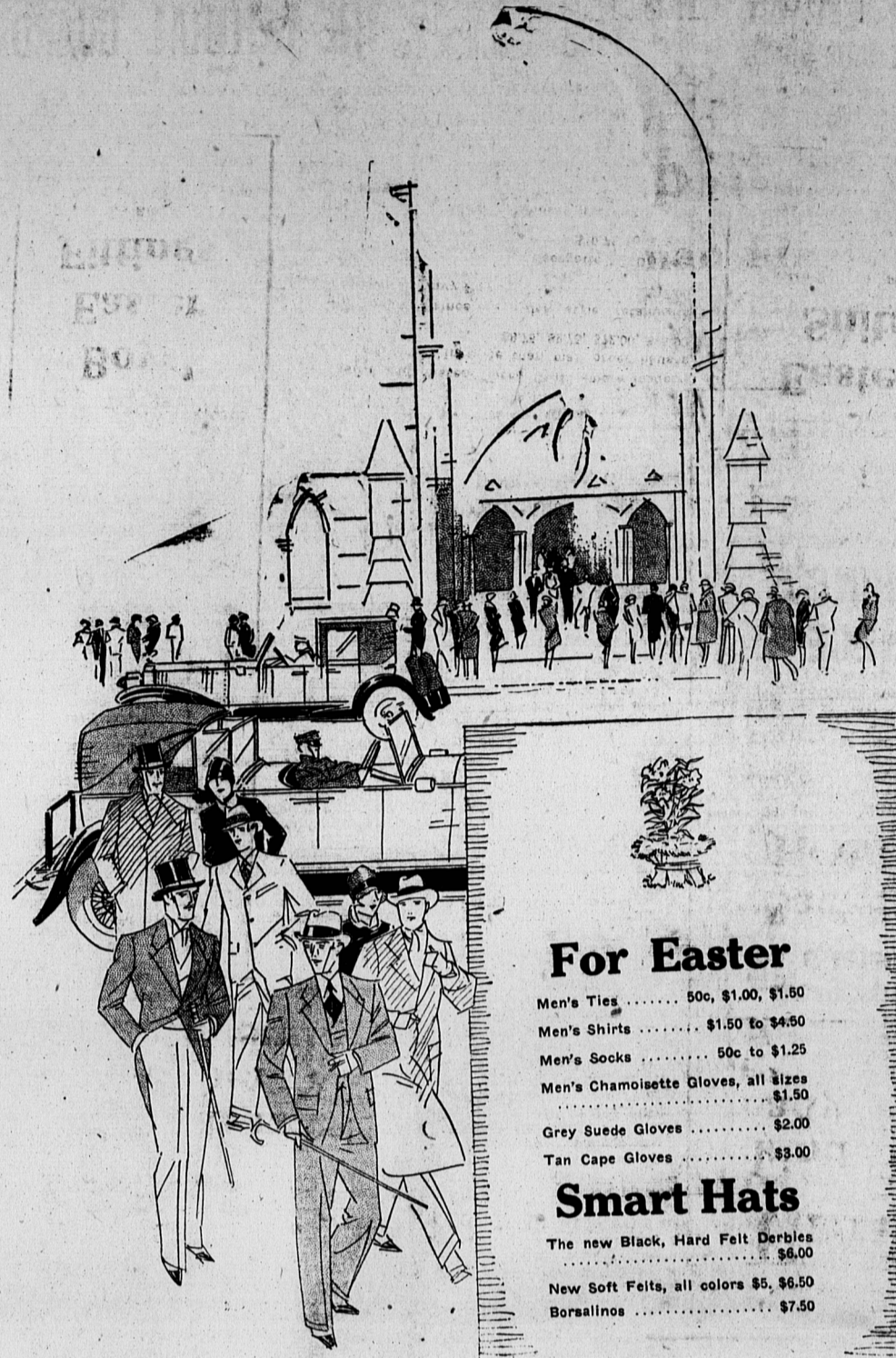
