All races mile heats, to be raced on the 3 heat plan viz:—10% of each purse will be awarded the winner, the remainder to be divided in three equal parts, one part to be raced for in each heat. In the event of there being three heat winners, a fourth heat shall be raced to decide the winner of the event. All purses divided 50, 25, 15 and 10%. Entry fee 5% of purse, and 5% amount raced for each heat deducted from money winners. Two entries of the same ownership may start in the same race, provided the full 5% is paid on each starter, and drivers having the approval of the Judges. The management reserve the right to declare off, change order of programme, decline any entry, bar any driver, declare off and fill without re-advertising any races not satisfactorily filled. If the weather is stormy, the management reserve the right to postpone or declare races off and return entrance money. Hay, straw and stabling free.
