SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

NOVEMBER 7.
PAUL A PRISONER—THE SHIPWRECK.
Acts 27:39-28:10.
GOLDEN TEXT.
"Jehovah redeemeth the soul of His servants; and none of them that take refuge in Him shall be condemned."—Ps. 34:22.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

No 206 in the "Canadian Hymnal" ought to be prayed and sung quite often in behalf of those "in peril on the sea." The vessel in which Paul was being taken a prisoner to Rome was one of the great "liners" of its day; but the waves and the tempest were too much for it, and the ocean greynights of our time, all too frequently meet with awful and tragic disaster. The thousand smaller craft, whose sailors seek a living from the sea, are daily exposed to dangers of which the landsman scarcely dreams.

Evidently there was an exciting time on that boat, driven to and fro in Adria—a wild time, in the extremity to which they came the sailors planned a treacherous and shameful thing; the soldiers counselled a terrible and gruesome thing; the captain gave himself up to the helplessness of despair; the prisoners were tortured by indescribable fears, from perils which rocked the vessel from without and from counsels as much to be dreaded from within. But Paul had himself in hand in self-control. No, he gave himself into God's hands and He held Paul fast. And the faith and courage of Paul held the captives—a man of much nobility of character.

The consequence was that the cowardly treachery of the sailors was foiled, the hands of the soldier were saved the stain of murder, the prisoners were given parole—the men who thought to save their unworthy skins at the cost of the lives of others had their skins saved and the commission of their crimes prevented—and they escaped all safe to land.

It is an ill wind, indeed, that blows nobody any good. The two hundred and seventy-six souls, who got to land the best way they could, upon a shore they knew nothing about, after many weeks of awful peril, and long days—fourteen at one stretch—without food, so great had been their fright and so earnest their prayers or deep their curses—thought things were against them surely. But the barbarous people heard the Gospel, and Paul's father and others were healed, and kindness and honor given and received, and history bears its message to the ages that "the peace of God," which kept Paul serene and masterful, "passeth all understanding."

The ordinary judgment of men are of little worth. Because a viper is on Paul's hand he is thought to be a murderer; because it is off, and no one hurt has followed, he is thought to be a god. And he never was either. Man judgeth by the outward appearance, but God looketh upon the heart.

Vipers fasten on men still. Ingratitude is an ugly thing, wounding and disastrous to the soul if it fastens there. Slander is another, and so is covetousness. The brush pile of Satan's devices breeds many of them. But they cannot abide where there is the fragrance of the Spirit's anointing. The fullness of the Spirit is the best antidote to the leap of one of Satan's vipers.

Paul is on his way to Rome. His course is not yet finished. But—the Lord permits to him a very strenuous, circuitous and heart-breaking route. What does it all mean? Well, "tribulation worketh patience; and patience, probation, and probation, hope, and hope putteth not to shame; because the love of God hath been shed abroad in our hearts through the Holy Ghost which is given unto us." Fullness of suffering is the price of fullness of character.—Oswald.

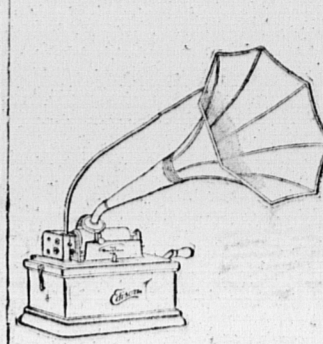
