**SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON**

the great Teacher. The Golden Text is most aptly chosen, and certainly describes this mission of teaching. Notice the inclusive note, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good." This we most certainly can see as we look back over the teaching of these lessons. An exposition of that inclusive declaration is then given in the words, "And what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God." The requirements are as to outward life that a man shall do justly and love mercy, and therefore as to the inward secret of life that he shall walk humbly with God.

We may divide the twelve lessons into two parts. In the first seven we have a remarkable unfolding of these thoughts of the Golden Text. In the last five we have a relation of great principles made specially to the disciples of our Lord.

As to the first seven, if we take the thoughts of the Golden Text backwards, we shall follow the order of our lessons. The Divine requirement as to the inner secret of life is that a man shall walk humbly with his God. Our first lesson had as its Golden Text words of Peter, "Likewise, ye younger, be subject unto the elder. You, all of you, gird yourselves with humility, to serve one another; for God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace to the humble," and the illustration of humility in the lesson is that of children and right relationship to them. The second lesson had as its Golden Text the words of Jesus, "For it is not ye that speak, but the Spirit of your Father that speaketh in you." The lesson itself dealt with the possibility of co-operation with Him in service, as in the case of the seventy, and thus revealed the privilege of walking with God.

The first expression of such walk in outward life is that of loving mercy.

Our third lesson was that of the good Samaritan, and the Golden Text, "Abou snait love thy neighbour as thyself"; while the fourth lesson was that of the story of service actually rendered to the Lord, in the days of His flesh, and its Golden Text, "Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of these, My brethren, even these least, ye did it unto me."

The Lord also requires that we shall do justly. Our fifth lesson was occupied with the teaching on prayer, and the parable of the unfriendly neighbor, showing how by prayer we are brought into fellowship with the very ways of God, and thus are enabled to do justly; the Golden Text being the charter of prayer, "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you." The sixth lesson emphasized the necessity for the true view-point, the difference between darkness and light, illustrated by the unjust conclusions which men came to concerning Christ, and the necessity for obtaining such view-point was emphasized in the Golden Text, "Look therefore whether the light that is in thee be not darkness."

The seventh lesson dealing with Christ's hatred of shams was remarkable in its revelation of His stern denunciation of men who lacked both justice and mercy in their dealing with their fellow men; and the solemnity of the teaching of the lesson was emphasized by the Golden Text, "He that deceiveth God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap."

The remaining five lessons deal with teaching given more especially to His disciples, and in them certain abiding principles of the life of discipleship are revealed. In the eighth the principle of a true confession of Christ is revealed to be that of the faith which makes fear impossible. In the ninth the principle of the fulfillment of life is revealed as that of having the heart set upon the true treasure which is spiritual rather than upon the false which is material. In the tenth the principle of faithful service is revealed as that of watchfulness for the returning King, expressed in perpetual service in His interest on behalf of His household. In the eleventh the principle of religion is revealed as that of compassion in which the true sanction of the Sabbath is recognized and fulfilled in such work as makes Sabbath possible to those who are in need. In the twelfth the principle of the Kingdom is revealed to be that of doing the will of God, rather than calling Him Lord.

Glancing thus over the whole of the teaching we conclude with the first declaration of the Golden Text, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good."

to 64c. at local points, malting barley is quoted at 54c to 55c, and feed barley at 48c.

Toronto prices for other grains are:—No. 3 Am. yellow corn, 69c; peas, 98c to \$1 buckwheat, 73c to 75c; rye, 62c to 63c per bu.

**MILLFEED**

Manitoba bran \$22.50 to \$23.50 per ton; Ontario bran, \$23 per ton in bags; Ontario shorts, \$24 per ton, and Ontario middlings, \$26.

**FLOUR**

Manitoba first patents are quoted at Toronto at \$5.40 in cotton sacks, seconds \$4.80 in sacks and strong bakers at \$4.60. Ontario new patent 40 per cent. flour is quoted at \$3.55.

**FRUIT AND VEGETABLES**

Potatoes in car lots on track are quoted at 80c. to 90c per bag, and on the St. Lawrence market at 90c to \$1 per bag. Beets command on the market \$1 to \$1.25 per bag, carrots \$1, parsnips \$1 to \$1.25. Canadian onions per sack \$2.50. Apples generally from \$2.50 per bu. to \$4.50.

**HAY AND STRAW**

On the Toronto market new timothy sold last week at \$17 to \$19 per ton, and mixed hay at \$15 to \$16 per ton. Straw loose sold at \$11 and bundled straw brought \$16 per ton.

**EGGS.**

With the cold weather of the past weeks, eggs went up in value, and in a wholesale way American cold-storage eggs sold to the retail trade at around 35c per dozen. Strictly fresh new laid marked eggs sold to the retail trade at 37c to 38c per dozen. On the St. Lawrence market farmers deliveries brought 35c to 40c per dozen.

**BUTTER**

There is an easier feeling in the butter market owing to the fact that old stocks are being worked off by the wholesale trade. New butter is in good demand, especially if of first class quality. Stored lots of butter command 24c. to 25c, creamery butter in packages from 28c to 30c, prints 32c to 34c, cooking butter is quoted at 18c. At local points butter is quoted generally at from 28c to 32c per lb. Montreal quoted finest creamery butter in a wholesale way at from 27c to 28c per lb. Manitoba dairy at 24c, and Ontario dairy at 23c to 24c per lb.

**CHEESE**

A firmer feeling is reported in cheese markets. Montreal quotations for finest Western colored at 14c to 14 1/2c, and finest white at 13c to 13 1/2c per lb.
