A system of marketing horses was begun Saturday when a number of horses were disposed of by auction on market square at good figures and the sale was attended by quite a large number of horsemen and farmers. It is proposed to hold these sales frequently so that owners and buyers of horses may have an opportunity of meeting each other where there is competition amongst sellers and purchasers and the animals sold on their merit. Horses can be more readily sold in this way and bought with less expense than by ordinary methods. The owner of a horse when disposed of pays a small entry fee and a small commission if the animal is sold. The next sale will take place two weeks from last date.
The regular meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last night with all members present. The tender of J. and T. Jardine of Hexton, N.-B. to supply lumber and the tender of Mr. Ellis, O'Leary to supply stone for street purposes were accepted. It was decided to build a fire tank at the corner of Central and Queen Streets. A bye law was passed fixing the rate of assessment on real estate and personal property at \$8 per \$1000. The clerk read an order previously sent to the Fairbanks Co., for a 1 1/2 horse power vertical, gasoline engine together with a pump for obtaining water for streets to cost \$147. On motion it was decided to accept same if properly guaranteed. The committee on bye laws was granted another month in which to bring in their report. Council adjourned.
