(Continued from page 1.) and thought better terms should have been obtained. We ought to be paid for the cost of the railway. He claimed that Canada had spent on railways and canals 143 millions more than was contemplated when the Island entered the union. Canada built the railway through Cape Breton, costing \$3,800,000, while we paid for our own railway. We are entitled to be repaid. Referring to the special allowance made to British Columbia, he thought we had far stronger claims to special treatment. That Province was extremely rich in lumber, coal and fisheries. We have no lumber and no minerals. He believed we would be better off had we remained out of confederation, unless we recover our just claims.

HON. JOSEPH READ quoted the late Hon. J. C. Pope and others to show that local taxation was anticipated but it was hoped would not come immediately after the union.

MR. McDONALD, A. J. said he was in the Legislature and heard the debates before the union. Confederation could not have been carried except for the belief that would prevent direct taxation. If the fuel is built it will be because we insist and because Canada cannot fulfil the agreement in any other way. Let the Government wake up and read the history of Ireland. (Laughter)

Adjourned till 8 o'clock. EVENING SESSION.

MR. McDONALD, A. J. in resuming the debate brought up the vast extension of Ontario, Quebec and Manitoba by giving them public lands which belonged to the whole country. We ought to be repaid for this. Our Government should wake up and not allow them to walk all over us.

HON. G. E. HUGHES claimed that the Government realized the situation fully. The people had justified the Government. The questions before (Continued on page 8.)
