I am always ready to challenge, said the baronet and if the New York Yacht Club would modify the rules requiring the challenging boat to cross the Atlantic on its own bottom, I believe I could build a boat to hold her own way with any American built boat of the same type, style and weight. If I build a freak boat and sail her across, they will build a lighter one here to beat me. There is no sport in that. Sir Thomas said that if he built another challenger he would name her the Shamrock IV.

BANKS CHECK PANIC.

BERLIN, October 14.—The panic on the bourse was checked today by the energetic action of the leading banks, which after a meeting, announced their intention of taking over as far as possible everything thrown on the market. The announcement was effectual even in the face of the news of the Turkish invasion of Servian territory, which it is thought is to be interpreted perhaps as the Ottoman government's answer to the notes from the Balkan states and a bold attempt by Turkey to interfere with the co-operation of the Servian and Bulgarian armies. Optimistic reports were also in circulation in connection with the Turco-Italian peace negotiations.

ROOSEVELT IS SHOT.

(Canadian Press) MILWAUKEE, WIS., Oct. 15.—Theodore Roosevelt, while driving to the Auditorium to deliver a campaign speech here yesterday was shot by an assassin and slightly wounded. The man, who is believed to be insane was immediately captured. The Colonel had a miraculous escape, the bullet being partly stopped by the manuscript of a speech he had in his pocket. At the time he did not know he was wounded and drove to the Auditorium where he spoke for an hour, growing gradually weaker, and continuing with obvious effort. At the conclusion of his speech he was rushed to the Hospital in an automobile, where cursory examination failed to reveal the location of the bullet. The X-ray appliance was sent for, meanwhile the third term aspirant was sitting on the edge of the operating table conversing with his physicians. At an early hour this morning the extent of injury had not been appraised.
