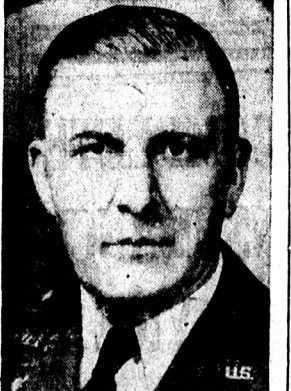

Censors Release Tale Of Atlantic Lifeline Menace

OTTAWA, May 15. — (CP) — Some details of the precarious position of British-Canadian seapower on the rugged North Atlantic during the ebb and flow of European war fortunes were disclosed here today for the first time. Relaxation of wartime censorship has resulted in the disclosure that a Canadian suggested the successful counter-measures which broke up Admiral Karl Doenitz' U-boat wolf-packs and helped to save the life line to Britain.

Design Corvettes
Empire naval officials met in emergency conference and outlined the immediate requirements of a ship which could be built speedily, could go deep, charge and had the endurance for the tough North Atlantic.

Design Corvettes
The wolf-pack tactics were launched and Allied merchant shipping reeled under the impact. The little corvettes and their backbone of destroyers hunted and kept long desperate vigil.

The Royal Navy accepted the suggestion of a counter-measure from four to seven ships — which later included American aircraft carriers — roamed the Atlantic and in the words of one high naval official "knocked the hell out of the wolf-packs."

Design Corvettes
The British developing a counter-measure as soon as the Germans brought out something new. The magnetic torpedo was followed in eight hours by British degaussing equipment which nullified their effect. The Germans started sending out long-range rocket-wolf bombers and the British replied with more effective anti-aircraft defences and long-range aircraft patrols.

Design Corvettes
Next came the acoustic torpedo and the flying bomb Radio-controlled gunnery nullified the flying bomb and other measures counteracted the acoustic torpedo.

Design Corvettes
The "Schnorkel" — long-distance breathing device by which the U-boat could remain submerged indefinitely — was the most recent development of the enemy.

Design Corvettes
A counter-measure, which still must remain secret, was devised. The nearest U-boats got to the deep water terminals a Halifax was 10 miles. They also struck up the St. Lawrence to near Rimouski, nearly 200 miles below Quebec City. U-boats torpedooed 20 ships in the St. Lawrence.

Design Corvettes
One high source said there was no foundation for wartime reports that U-boats operated in Hudson Bay. That U-boats carried V-bombs off the East Coast and that a U-boat launched a hydro-plane bound for Quebec during the first Churchill-Roosevelt conference.

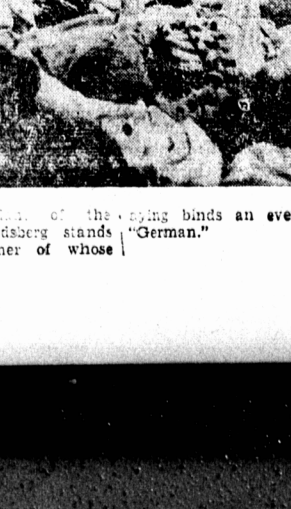
