



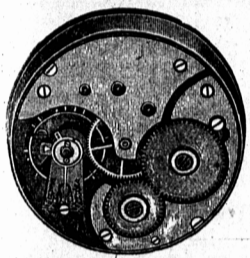

## THE GUARDIAN LOCAL NEWS

### Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

JAMES Lonergan, the well known lunch man has the thanks of The Guardian for a handsome calendar for 1905.

THE young people of Sea View and surrounding districts have recently organized a debating club. They held their meetings in the school house on Thursday evenings. The chief promoters of the club are Jas Campbell, Pres., A. Malone, W. Stewart, Geo Stewart, J. T. McKay and E. Graham. The subject of discussion at the meeting on the 17th inst was, "Which is the more pleasing to the eye the works of art or the works of nature" and was carried with a passing majority, for the latter. A pleasing feature of the meetings is that all the members take an active part.

THE death occurred at Millview on Oct. 27th of Robert Wood, aged 62 years. Mr. Wood had been in failing health for some time but was only confined to his room for two weeks previous to his death. Though a great sufferer he never murmured throughout his illness. He bore his sufferings with Christian resignation and a calm assurance of eternal rest beyond the grave; death found him willing to answer the call. Deceased was a kind friend and obliging neighbor and will be much missed in the community in which he lived. His remains were laid in Floral Cemetery, the funeral ceremonies being conducted by Rev. Mr. Thomas. He leaves to mourn a widow, three sons and three daughters, all of whom have the sympathy of many friends. (Other papers please copy.)

In a letter received from Ensign W H Squarebriggs, Fall River, Mass., he says: "The City of Fall River, Mass at the present is suffering a great deal because of the 25,000 now on strike and over 100 Cotton Mills are idle. They have been on strike for 16 weeks and the end is not yet. The manufacturers gave a cut down of 12 1/2% and 12 looms to run instead of 8 looms. The Salvation Army here is doing relief work to the amount of over \$200.00 a week. We feed fifteen hundred poor people on hot meals at noon time every day and the many cases of destitution is heartrending. The business in the city is suffering and depression is the order of the day. The Salvation Army in this city is in a good thriving condition having a beautiful Citadel and Parsonage worth \$30,000. I find a good many Islanders here and they are doing well and making a mark for themselves. (Ensign Squarebriggs, mentioned, is the second son of Henry Squarebriggs formerly of Souris but now of Charlottetown.)"

At Rustico Road on Oct 30<sup>th</sup> h. 1904, in the 75th year of her age, Mrs Thursa Carter departed this life. Deceased came to P. E. I. from England in childhood with her parents. She was an invalid for a very considerable time, being the victim of nervous troubles, till death ended her bodily sufferings. Her affliction was borne with cheerfulness and Christian fortitude. Naturally she was religiously inclined and became a member of the Bible Christian Church in very early life, and afterwards of the Methodist Church, a devoted and loyal member of which she remained till she joined the Church Triumphant. Her home was always the ministers' home. Her charming personality, amiable disposition, and simple piety, made her a beloved neighbor, dutiful wife and a most kind and affectionate mother. Her Christian character and godly nurture of her children made a lasting impression on them for good. Much was her good counsel and devotion to them be missed by those who survive her. She leaves to mourn her loss Mrs. Captain Walpo, Mrs A. Down, and two sons—Isaac and Hammond. May the consolations of divine grace be their portion during their time of sorrow.

## PROF. ROBERTSON'S NEW POSITION

OTTAWA, Nov. 19.—Hon. Sydney Fisher has confirmed the announcement that Prof. Robertson has resigned office as Commissioner of Agriculture and Dairying to become the head of an agricultural college to be erected at St. Anne de Bellevue, on Montreal Island, by Sir Wm. MacDonald, the millionaire tobaccoist of Montreal. The position for which Sir Wm. MacDonald has selected Prof. Robertson has grown out of the association of the two gentlemen in the introduction and development of education work along such lines as manual training and nature study, in the establishment of an institute for teachers and instructors in manual training and domestic science at Guelph and in the inauguration of consolidated schools throughout Canada. Towards these works Sir William MacDonald has been a generous donor, and his latest project is to establish at Ste. Anne's an agricultural college and experimental station similar to the Provincial college at Guelph for this purpose. Sir William some time ago bought the Robert Reford Farm consisting of 300 acres which is regarded as the finest farm on the Island of Montreal. He has also purchased 400 additional acres, so that in all 700 acres will be available for Sir William MacDonald's great plan. The idea of the founder is to establish an institution in which all branches of agriculture can be given and original research conducted. The experimental station would, of course, be available for the varied experiments in the growing of crops.
