Oil Wells In Oklahoma Ordered Closed. OAKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. Aug 5.—Governor Williams Murray late today issued an executive order shutting down 3,106 prorated oil wells in Oklahoma and establishing martial law for a distance of 50 feet around each well. The Governor's order includes all oil wells under proration order of the staff corporation commission and excluded stripped wells, which are defined as producing twenty-five barrels a day or less.
