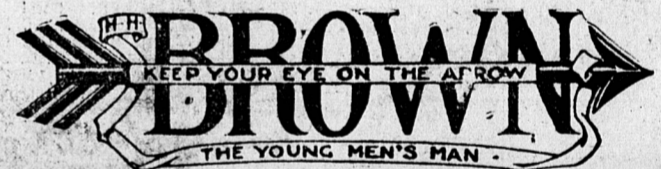

WILL START A WORLD-PAPER

International Daily to Deal Only With Matters of World-Wide Importance to be Established in Paris.

NEW YORK, June 25.—Theodore Stanton, son of Elizabeth Cady Stanton, who returned from Europe on Saturday, brought with him the news that a number of prominent and influential men in Europe and this country are behind a movement to publish what will be known as an international daily newspaper. The plans have progressed so far that it has been decided to begin publishing the paper in Paris in January.

"For a long while," said Mr. Stanton yesterday, "certain men in Europe have had under consideration the advisability of starting an international daily newspaper. These men believe there was a field for it, but it was necessary to find out how the proposition would be received in the capitals and large cities of the world. For the purpose of learning the attitude of officialdom and men connected with affairs in these centres of activity I was selected to make a journey to every capital of Europe. I have just finished the trip, which took three months, and I am convinced that such a newspaper has a place in the scheme of things."

"Such a newspaper to be a success necessarily must be absolutely independent and self-supporting. One of the first things to be considered was the question of international advertising. From what I could find out we shall have sufficient advertising support to make the paper independent. At least enough interest was taken in the proposition to indicate that the newspaper will not lack advertising support."

the extent of expressing his individual views and opinions. There will be a corps of editors and I shall be the managing editor. The paper will have no policy. It will aim to publish truthfully and accurately both sides of all questions of worldly wide interest.

"A feature of the management of the paper will be a committee called the international advisory editorial board. On this board will be representative or representatives from every country in the world. As the list is not completed I shall not mention any names now, but I can say that the men will be of importance to their own lands equal to that of Senator Root in this country. There is a well known Liberal of the House of Lords, a Spanish senator and an Italian senator among those who have already agreed to act on this editorial board. The board will meet annually or semi-annually in Paris and it is expected that there will be about 30 members so far no Frenchman has been appointed to this board and there may not be a French representative. The explanation for this is that should the paper be published in Paris, deal with something in it which France was interested in, might be said that we were favoring the French side."

"As to the kind of news we shall publish. Should the Metropolitan Opera House in this city be destroyed I doubt if we should even mention it. Of course if the Berlin Opera House should be destroyed and the Emperor of Germany killed that would be a different thing, but solely from the standpoint of the effect the death of the Emperor would have on Germany's internal affairs and foreign policy. Of course the congressional debate on Canadian reciprocity would be reported and both the American and Canadian sides of the question would be impartially presented. The Mexican troubles, the situation in Portugal and Spain today and such matters of international importance would be considered fully. Not only would the side of the Government and those in authority be presented but also the opposition."

"The foreign news department of the paper will be in charge of Ferdinand Leipnik, city editor of the Pesther Lloyd, published in Budapest. Of course that will be an important department. At the present time the big newspapers are national newspapers in that they deal with the affairs of their own country principally. But the news in our paper will be international, dealing with all important questions in a comprehensive manner."
