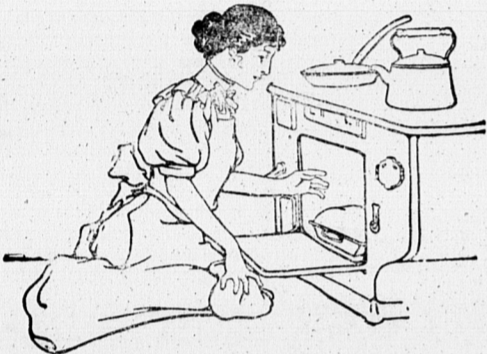

Senator Robertson, Montague, passed through Summerside yesterday en route to Ottawa.

The special train from Charlottetown yesterday brought about eighty passengers to and from the football sports on the Summerside Driving Park.

The man, Peacock, who was wounded in the shooting accident at Bedouin, Monday, is doing as well as can be expected. The doctors now say the arm will be saved.

With the exception of oats the Summerside market prices remain unchanged. Butter is twenty to twenty-five cents per pound, potatoes twenty cents a bushel, oats thirty-nine and forty cents a bushel, and pork eight to eight and three quarter cents per pound.

A large steam engine and the outfit for a lumber mill arrived by the Empress yesterday, from St. John, N. B., for John M. Clark, and is being sent forward to the Elmira branch of the P. E. I. R. Mr Clark is erecting a lumber mill on the branch and expects to have it in operation early in the winter.

Yesterday a very strenuous game of football was played on the Summerside Driving Park, between teams from St. Dunstan's College and Lenox Island. The teams were very evenly matched and owing to the high wind the ball was kept in the scrim. In this game the Saints showed their superiority. The first half ended no score. After half the Saints had the wind in their favor and took advantage of it. After repeated efforts the wee captain of the Saints, Bradford McNeill, got the ball over for a try, which was beautifully converted by Harold Gillis, making the score 5-0 in favor of the Saints. They had now seven minutes to play. The Saints made repeated efforts to score again but were held in check by their opponents. When the time expired the play was in central field but the victory was clear for Old St. Dunstan's. The only white man in the Lenox Island team was Urban Gillis, who put up a great fight for his side. Score ended 5-0.
