Sunday School Lesson

OUR RISEN LORD

MATT. 28:1-10.
Sunday School (Easter) Lesson, April 20, 1918.

Paul regards the resurrection of Christ as the key-stone of the arch of the Christian faith. If this were to be removed the whole structure would topple to the ground. "If Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain... If Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins." (1 Cor. 15:14, 17). But there was nothing of which Paul was more certain than the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. He knows this by a personal experience—"Have I not seen Jesus Christ our Lord?" He knew it by the testimony of many witnesses, to whom the risen Lord had appeared on different occasions, and he knew it by the fruits of the spirit in the lives of believers.

There is no event in all history for which there is more overwhelming evidence than the resurrection of Christ. But we do not have to depend upon ancient records, however convincing these are; we have the proof of this crowning miracle of our Lord's life on earth ever with us. Professor James Denney puts this proof very tersely as follows:

If anybody asked you to the proofs of the resurrection into three words, I think you might put them thus: The first evidence of the resurrection is the Lord's Day. The sanctity of the first day of the week can be traced back to nothing except this, that on the first day of the week the great decisive event took place which launches the Christian religion into history and made that day forever sacred, and that event was the rising of Jesus from the dead.

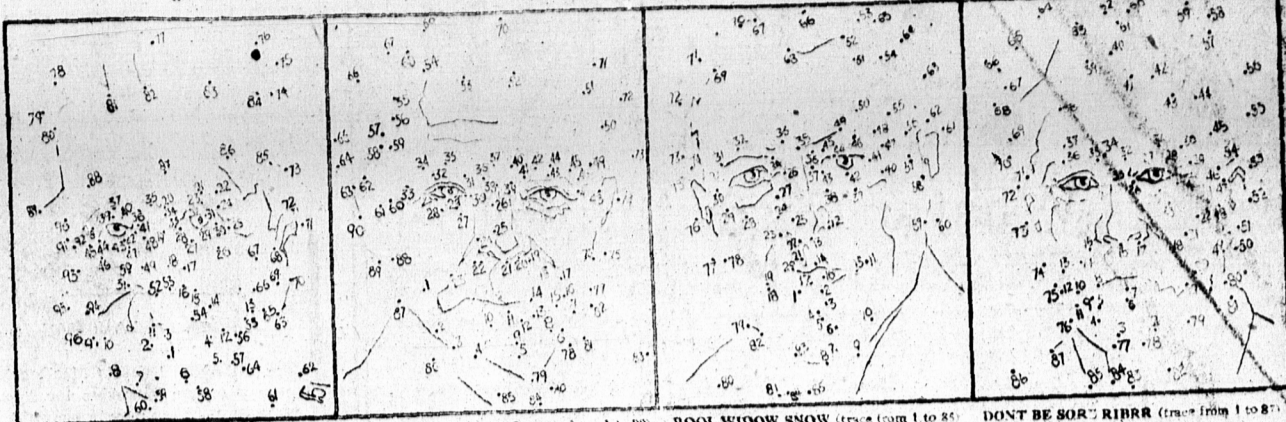
The second evidence is the New Testament. The New Testament is the book of the resurrection; it is the book of the risen Lord. The life that beats in the pages of the New Testament is life derived from him. If Jesus had not risen, and if he had not imparted his own life to those who had lived along with him and believed in him, then not a single word of the New Testament would have been in existence. The New Testament from first to last has the breath of the resurrection life in it, and it is that by which it lives.

And the third evidence for the resurrection is the Lord's people. It is the existence of the Christian Church. Jesus said, "Because I live, ye shall live also," and the fact that we do live is conversely the truth that he still lives. Every thing Christian is living by the power of Christ's resurrection, and is in himself a living evidence that the Lord reigns. So these three things, the Lord's Day and the Lord's Book, and the Lord's people, are the three irrefragable, indestructible evidences of his resurrection.

But for our belief in the resurrection of Christ and all that this involves life would be unspeakably dark. Especially in those tragic days, when so many of our bravest and best have passed beyond our vision; the hope of a future life—a hope which is based upon the resurrection of Christ—has been our great comfort and stay. Some years ago a powerful story was published, entitled "When it was Dark." The story represented what would happen if the resurrection of Christ were proved a fraud. Its purpose was to picture the utter darkness and gloom which would settle down upon the minds of men, with the downfall of their faith. The story made a great impression both in Great Britain and America, and was highly commended by the Bishop of London. In Rogers' Eclipse of Faith, there is one chapter entitled "The Blank Bible." A man dreamed that in one night, all the Bibles in the world and all the quotations from the Bible were changed into blank paper, and that the world awoke next morning to find that it had no Bible, and that the best part of literature was gone. If Christ had not risen, and the world had only a dead Christ, infinitely more would be taken from it than if we had but a blank Bible. If the story of Christ's resurrection were an idle tale there would be no gospel for the world—there never would have been a gospel—and no certain hope of any life beyond the present. It is impossible for us to imagine the full consequences to us individually and to the whole world of such an eclipse of faith. But we do not need to try to imagine such a calamity, for we can confidently say with Paul; "But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept." We know that He lives, and this is the guarantee of the fulfillment of all His promises. Because He lives, we too shall live. He came that we might have life and that we might have it abundantly—a fuller life even in this world, and in the world to come life everlasting.

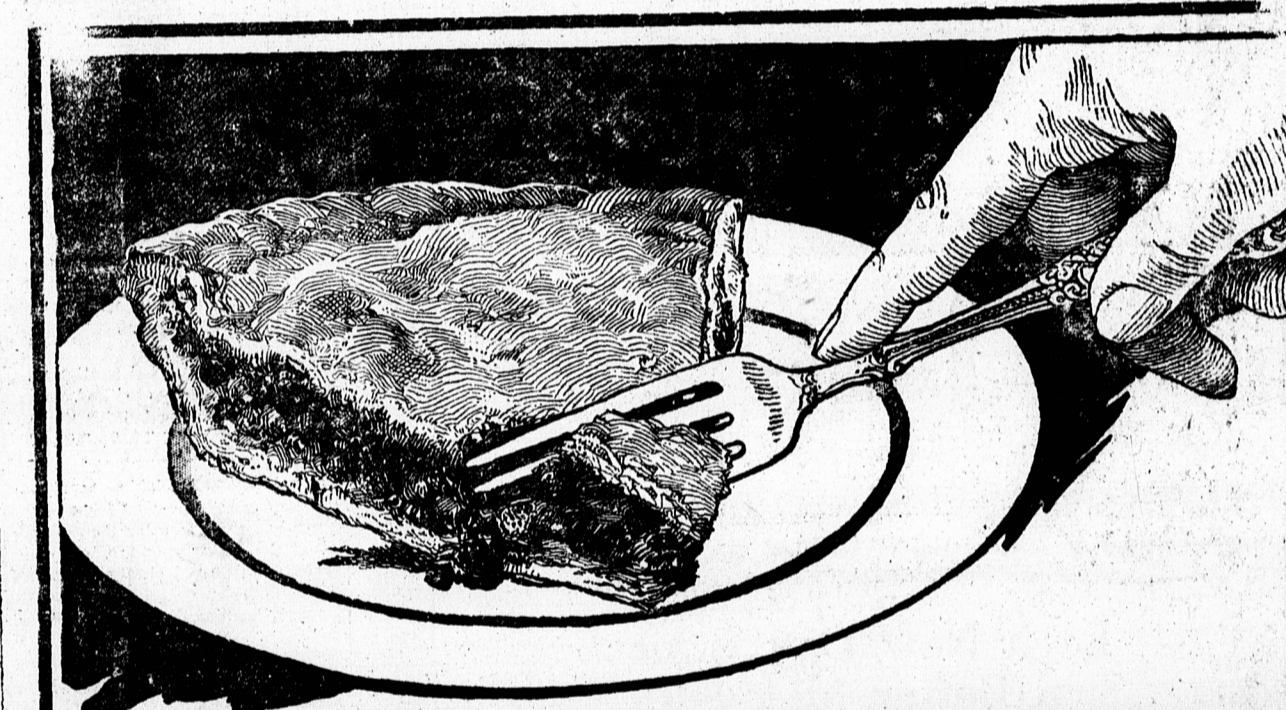
