

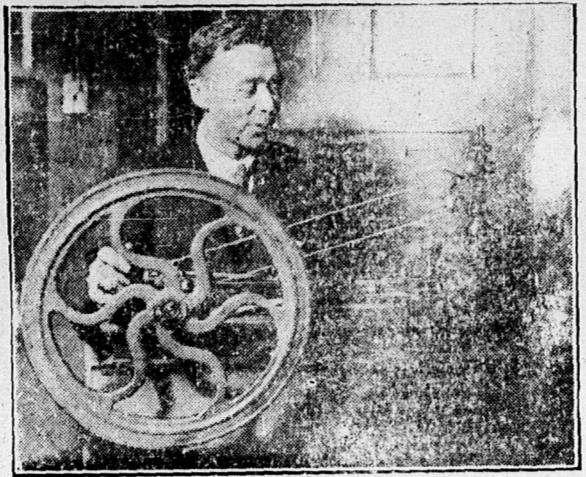

Their Throne Is Jeopardized



Above are shown King Alfonso and Queen Victoria of Spain, whose throne is jeopardized by bursting into flame of a general revolutionary movement, which has thrown their country into turmoil. Two revolutionary leaders were reported shot yesterday, while general strikes have terrorized sections of the country, with aeroplanes dropping pamphlets in Madrid in the name of "the army and the people." King Alfonso is said to have declared that he would prefer death to abdication.

Beck's First Steam Engine



A small steam engine of first-class workmanship and design, capable of generating nearly one horse power, which was designed and built by Sir Adam Beck in his boyhood days, has been given to the Public Utilities Commission of London, Ont., by Sir Adam's sister-in-law, widow of the late Fritz Beck of London. The engine was built by Sir Adam in his father's shop in Baden, Ont., when he was a young lad. More of its history is being sought by E. V. Eno, human general manager of the P.U.C. in London, Ont., who is shown in the picture with this reminder of the bygone days.

First Jew Mayor



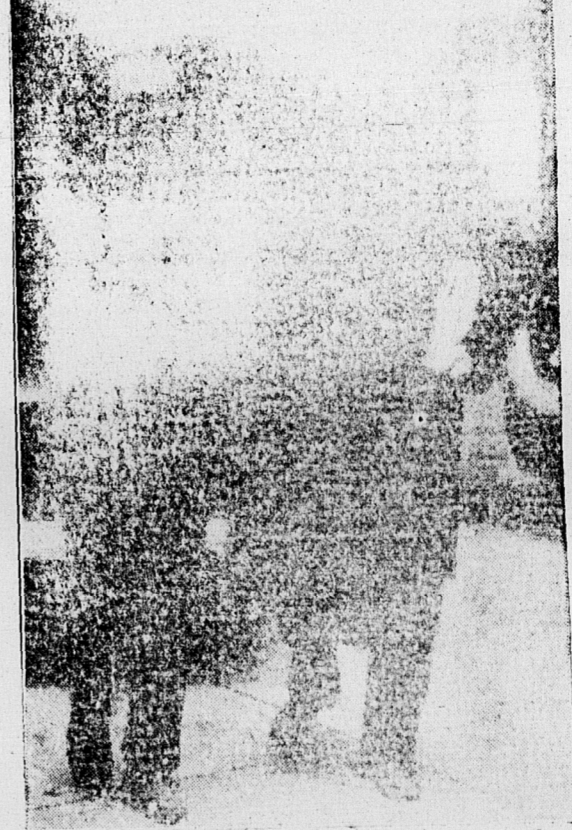
Daniel A. Cohn, recently elected mayor of Windsor, Ont., who is the first Jew to hold such office in Canada.
