JASPER PARK.

Pleasure seekers and tourists are impatient for the opening of travel to Jasper Park, C. B. During the past summer a number of parties travelled to the end of the steel and then trailed away into this newly discovered wonderland of the West. They all came out with enthusiastic reports of the grandeur of the scenery along the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific.

The party met the outfit at mile 62 (Hinton) and from there rode to mile 110, and the journey across Shovel Pass to Lake Malgine was made over the excellent trail which has been built by the Otto Brothers for the Park authorities in the spring.

From the time of leaving Hinton the scenery grew steadily more interesting and beautiful. Malgine Lake was the climax of the trip. It is a quiet lake in the succession of constantly changing views—snow-capped mountains, and wooded foreground—which opens up as one rounds one promontory after another through the length of its eighteen miles. The party spent ten days camping at three different points on the lake, exploring valleys and climbing mountain ridges, each of which disclosed new beauties.

On our return we took the train at the end of steel, ten mile 99. We are glad of this opportunity to express our appreciation for the thoughtfulness and courtesy of all the Grand Trunk officials on the construction trains. The tramp was undertaken on the recommendation of the Otto Brothers, who had previously guided some members of the party in the region near Field, B. C. Their enthusiastic reports of the new country to which they had moved were more than justified. The party consisted of Miss E. B. Kirkbride and Miss M. B. Kirkbride of Philadelphia, Miss Marion H. Tabor, Miss Josephine Tabor, Miss Elsie Powell, Alfred Killner, Edward Ingraham and myself, all of New York.

GIRLS OPPOSE CAP AND GOWN.

NORTHAMPTON, Feb. 8.—Smith College seniors began voting today whether they will wear a cap and gown at commencement or white dresses, with each girl carrying a red rose. Those advocating the more alluring garb say they will win. The voting will continue until Saturday night. The advocates of cap and gown say that dress is more appropriate to commencement and that it saves expensive rivalry in clothes. The opponents argue that each girl needs at least one white dress for commencement and that the cap and gown are simply added expense. So far as the classical appropriateness of the cap and gown go, the white dress and red rose advocates say Smith College is not trying to ape customs of men's colleges, anyhow, and that cap and gown give the false impression that the girls are putting intellectually above everything.

LONDON, Feb. 10.—Rev. D. Andrew Martin Fairbairn, Principal Emeritus of Mansfield College, died today. He was born in 1838. Dr. Fairbairn, besides being one of the best known educationists in England was the author of numerous works on religious subjects. Yale University conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Divinity in 1889.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8.—Charles M. Schwab, the steel magnate of Bethlehem (Pa.), testified today before the Senate finance committee on the probable effect of the house Democratic steel bill. He said the Underwood rates on larger steel products would be of most serious consequences to the steel business in the eastern states, and he undertook to make plain his attitude.
