ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

ST. DUNSTON'S College re-opens today.

The steamer Bonavista arrived at half past nine last night from Montreal.

LEUTENANT Governor McIntyre and Colonel Moore D. O. C. visiting the warships on Saturday afternoon and were received with a salute of seven guns.

THREE drunks named Patrick Prunty, Joseph Conway and George Brown (colored) were locked up at the Police Station Saturday night for indulging too freely.

Rev. Dr. Devins and party of New York are registered at the Queen. Dr. Devins gave an address at the Y. M. C. A. in the afternoon and preached in Zion Church in the evening.

COUNCILLOR GRANT lost a valuable horse a few nights ago in its stable at the rear of Russel House. The animal became entangled in its tying rope during the night and was strangled.

THE staging at Pownal Wharf for landing from the warships gave away yesterday afternoon and several persons were precipitated into the water. There were no more serious consequences to them than a wetting however and all were rescued with little difficulty.

THE merchants and others desiring space in the Exhibition Building at the coming exhibition, should not forget that the Directors will meet them on the grounds this morning at 11 o'clock, when spaces will be allotted. All should make a display and the management will try to find room for all.

THE Provincial Grand Stand will hold thousands every afternoon for six days of the big Halifax Exhibition to witness the racing of the fleetest horses in the Maritime Provinces, which will compete on a very fast track, for purses aggregating \$3,000. Records will be clipped beyond the shadow of a doubt. Over one hundred separate entries have been received.

THE men from the warships will not land to-day and be reviewed at Victoria Park. Instead they will give an exhibition of boat drill commencing at nine o'clock, which will consist of manning the boats taking guns on board and after proceeding some distance firing them. This drill will continue several hours. Admiral Douglas regrets that he is unable to give the citizens an opportunity of witnessing a review at the Park but hopes to do so on his next visit to this port. The band from the Ariadne will play at the park during the afternoon.

OBITUARY.—We deeply regret to record the death of John Francis Monaghan, son of Thomas Monaghan, one of the most respected and promising young men of South Melville, Lot 29, which occurred at his father's residence on the 2nd inst., after a lingering illness, in the 26th year of his age. The deceased was a young man of irreproachable character—sober, industrious and attentive to his spiritual duties, and his early demise is keenly regretted by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. His funeral took place at Kelly's Cross on the 4th inst., and was one of the largest seen in that section for some time, there being, although it took place in the busy season, 42 carriages in the procession.
