## SAY THEY WERE TREATED UNFAIR

NEW YORK, Aug. 2.—Six American athletes who participated in the Olympic games at London, arrived here tonight on the American line steamer St. Paul. So joyful were the Americans at getting back to their native land that they sported about the deck of the steamer like school boys when they caught sight of the statue of Liberty and when they saw the American flag streaming from the little revenue cutter coming down the bay to meet the steamer they pointed to it and sang patriotic songs. The athletes supported the charges of unfair treatment of the Olympic officials and each member of the party put himself on record that he would never compete again in English sports.

## C.P.R. WILL NOT GET STEEL PLANT

SAULT STE MARIE, Aug. 3.—Reports say the bidding in of stocks and bonds by the Philadelphia interests which took over the control of the Lake Superior corporation means that the Canadian Pacific will not secure the Steel plant and the Algoma Central as recently reported. It is said the Steel plant will take over the rail mill and stocks were bid at Philadelphia. It is reported that MacKenzie and Mann have bought out the Canadian Pacific interests and will take over the Algoma road, which will become part of the Canadian Northern system. A. C. Boyce, M. P., will bring the Steel question up before the Dominion Parliament and a fight is expected with reference to the Grand Trunk Pacific, which, it is alleged, violated its placing large order for rails with the agreement with the Government by Trust, while the plant here was closed and in position to fill orders.

## THE GUARDIAN'S BICYCLE ROAD RACE

The date of The Guardian's bicycle road race has been definitely fixed for Monday August twenty-four. If this date should prove unfavorable the race will take place on the following evening. Entries are to be confined to Prince Edward Island riders alone. The race is for The Guardian's three-year trophy, but in addition there will be a number of other prizes which will be announced in a few days. The course begins at The Guardian office in Charlottetown and follows Grafton Street, then crossing on to the Upper Malpeque Road to the Upper Malpeque Road which it follows to this side Milton station, thence taking the road to the left which runs alongside Moore's Mill stream and on to Warren's Corner, North River. From this corner the course will be across the North River Bridge to the Royal Arms, thence by Lower Malpeque Road to Brighton Road following Brighton Road out to the shore, then taking the Park Road, following the same round the Park and so to starting place—16 miles.

## OF INTEREST TO THE PUBLIC.

MONTREAL, Aug. 3.—The General Baggage Department of the Grand Trunk Railway System has just issued a summary of the rules and regulations governing baggage car traffic for the guidance of baggage masters, station and train baggagemen on the entire system, and this pocket manual pertaining to their duties is designed to provide not alone for the usual conduct of the business, but also desired in case of all kinds of contingencies, and perplexities, which may assail the employees of the Baggage Department. The Manual consists of 68 pages, and an examination of the book indicates the very important part the Baggage Department of a great Railway System plays in the conduct of the passenger traffic, and the assurance that passengers may feel that their personal belongings which accompany them in the baggage car are being carefully watched, and that the liability for the loss either temporary or permanent is arriving at the dispatch point by the foresight and care exercised in directing the operation of this important branch of the service. There is a distinct effort made in this book to have ever present in the mind of the employee of the Baggage Department that his first duty is to the public, and to illustrate this, on the first page of the book appears such clauses as the following: "The relations and responsibilities of the public carriers to the travelling public are such as require from the carrier the most constant and watchful care of the property of the traveller. "As Station and Train Baggage-masters you are entrusted with the safekeeping and proper transportation of effects which are valuable to the owners. Nothing can be more annoying to travellers than the loss of abuse of or delay to their baggage. "You must try to give satisfaction to the public and establish a reputation for courtesy and civility to everyone. You are expected to be polite at all times, to answer civilly all questions addressed to you, and if unable to give any necessary information, endeavor when practicable, to obtain it if pertaining to baggage car traffic, if not, the passenger should be directed to the proper office. Endeavor to make the Grand Trunk Railway System popular; its business is dependent upon the good-will of the people." It is expected that in this manner the employees of the Baggage Department will appreciate that in serving the public intelligently and well, they are serving their employers equally, as without this spirit to co-operate, neither the public nor those in charge of the different Departments of a great Railway System are reasonably satisfied.

## BISLEY MEDAL AND JEWELS STOLEN

LONDON, Aug. 3.—The gold medal which the American rifle team recently won at Bisley, with the championship of the world, and another medal commemorative of American prowess in the Olympic contest, have been stolen by a smart hotel thief, and General J. A. Drain, who had them in his custody, is also lamenting the loss of valuable jewellery belonging to his wife, which disappeared at the same time. General Drain, who is president of the American Rifle Association, and adjutant general of the General United States militia, has been staying at the hotel Victoria, one of the 113 hotels near Trafalgar Square. After breakfast Tuesday General and Mrs. Drain went for a walk, leaving the key of their room at the outset. When they returned Mrs. Drain went up stairs, the general, who remained below, to telephone, telling her to have the room opened by one of the maids with a pass-key. On going upstairs the general was met by his wife with the statement that the room had been entered and the leather bag which contained Mrs. Drain's jewel case cut open between the steel frames, and all the contents stolen. Besides the gold Olympic championship medal and bronze commemorative medal, the jewellery stolen includes three diamond rings and two necklaces Mrs. Drain fortunately was wearing some of her most valuable rings.
