THE LIQUOR PROBLEM WAS WELL DISCUSSED

TORONTO, Feb. 17.—After every conceivable question bearing on the solution of the liquor problem in the different provinces of the Dominion has been thoroughly debated the National Temperance Congress and the Ontario Provincial convention concluded their sessions yesterday afternoon.

Amongst the resolutions drafted by the business committee of the Dominion organization and adopted by the Convention was the following:

Resolved that the Dominion Council reaffirm its belief that the final solution of the liquor problem is the prohibition of the manufacture, importation and sale of alcoholic beverages and that therefore it is the duty of citizens to unite for the purpose of securing that end.
