PROF. ROBERTSON and Mr. Collier visited the Summerside schools Monday afternoon and explained to the teachers the principles of the McDonald Sloyd System of Manual Training. In the evening they addressed a meeting of citizens in the Board of Trade Rooms at which Mr. R. C. McLeod, Chairman of the School Board, presided. Prof. Robertson explained fully the origin, aim and method of the system, a full account of which was given in THE GUARDIAN a few days ago. His address was a most interesting one, and was listened to with the closest attention. Mr. Collier in a short and well worded address gave a general idea of the practical side of the subject. At the close of the meeting the following resolution was moved by Stipendiary Magistrate McQuarrie, seconded by Mayor Campbell: That the thanks of this meeting representing the town of Summerside be rendered to Sir Wm. C. McDonald for his kind remembrance for the people of his native province in the establishment of a system of Manual Training in the schools of Charlottetown and Summerside, and for placing the inauguration of this movement in the hands of so able an exponent as Prof. Robertson. A meeting of the School Board was afterwards held at which an agreement was entered in to with Prof. Robertson embodying the necessary arrangements for the adoption in Summerside of the McDonald Lloyd system of manual training.
