## Japanese Made Slaves In Canada So Report Says

### Laborers are Held at Vancouver Under Bondage to Companies Who Bring them From Home—Plans Adopted by Companies.

VANCOUVER, B. C. Nov. 16.—Hidden factors in Japanese immigration into Canada were revealed by the questions of Mr. MacKenzie King, deputy Minister of Labor who was special commissioner in hearing the claims of Japanese for losses during the riot here.

Kazuo Ishikawaga, president of the Japanese boarding house keepers' union of Vancouver, and head of the Canada Kangyo Company, an employment agency with headquarters here, was the witness at the time. Evidence was adduced that Japanese laborers are brought to British Columbia and held in conditions of slavery.

### EXTRAORDINARY PRECAUTIONS TO SAVE DOUMA

LONDON, Nov. 16.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the "Tribune," referring to the extraordinary precautions attendant upon the coming opening of the Douma, for protecting the deputies and for limiting the admission of the public to sessions, declares that they are due to the authorities fearing an attempt will be made to blow up the Tauride Palace, where the Douma meets their apprehensions being based on a story communicated to Premier Stolypin by an insignificant journalist. The correspondent ridicules the story, but says he learns that many officials appointed to Douma's service have resigned in consequence of it.
