ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

THE express arrived last night at twenty-five after nine.

REV. A. F. BROWN will preach at Long Creek Thursday evening May 21.

A TELEGRAM to W. W. Clark yesterday announced that the Halifax would reach the city at noon.

GANONG BROS.' new factory in St. Stephen will be completed in July next. It is to be one of the most modern in Canada.

At the Police Court yesterday James McMillan, a laboring man, was fined four dollars or 15 days for drunkenness. He paid the fine.

THE Pictou football team have decided to play here on Victoria Day. The local team that will meet them will be composed of Victorias and members of the St. Dunstan's College team.

REV. E. GILLIS' resignation of Murray Harbor South, P. E. I., takes effect on the last Sabbath of May. Ministers desirous of a hearing should correspond with Rev. R. G. Sinclair, Montague, the interim moderator.

THE schooner James W., Captain Murchison, leaves this morning in tow of the William Atken for Port Hawkesbury, where she will go on the Marine Slip for repairs after her recent severe voyage from Barbadoes.

HUGH TRAINOR received a telegram yesterday afternoon stating that the body of his son, Hugh Trainor, will arrive Wednesday evening from South Boston. The remains will be accompanied by two union men.

PROHIBITION summonses have been served on George Arbutuckle for second offence, and Joseph Grant, who keeps in the store formerly occupied by Angus McDonald, for first offence. Both are returnable on Friday.

It is expected that the plans from Architects Harris and Chappell for the new market house will be ready today or tomorrow, after which tenders will immediately be called. A special meeting of the City Council will be held this week to consider the yearly estimates.

It is suggested since both the Abegweit and the Victorias have football games on for Victoria Day with Nova Scotia teams, that they play a practice game some evening during the week. The Victorias are quite willing for a match, and it is hoped that such may be arranged during the week.

At a recital given by graduates of Emerson College of Oratory in Chickering Hall, Boston last week, Miss Amy M. Carver, Pownal, and Miss Marion Berkeley Clapp, who visited with her on the Island during last summer, were among the prominent performers. The audience, says a Boston exchange, was a very fashionable one. Both talented young ladies graduated with honors from Emerson this year.

It is reported at Pictou that the Minto will go on the Fishery Service shortly after the Staeler, when she comes off the slip at Pictou the last of the week will be sent for repairs either to some Canadian port across the Atlantic; it is understood most likely the former. The St. Am Navigation boats will also have to slip on the slip in a week or two and it is probable that one of the Government boats will take the place on one of the routes.

The teaching of nature study in the city public schools is becoming more popular each year and the excellent methods adopted by many of the city teachers as well as the fascination of the subject has made this branch the most popular on the school curriculum. A few days ago Principal Newson of West Kent School gave his scholars a botanical excursion to Rocky Point where a large number of specimens were collected. On the return compositions were written on the features of the trip and the knowledge that had been gained by the pupils.

CONTRACTOR WILLARD KITCHEN of the Murray Harbor Railway, expects to have the complete line of railway laid to Southport in four months time. The work of laying rails through Kincross, Vernon River, etc., will be begun shortly.

At an examination concluded on Friday last at the Charlottetown Business College, Walter Trainor, son of Patrick Trainor, Esq., carriage builder, Kelly's Cross, Lot 29, passed most creditably and received the College Diploma. Mr. Trainor was a splendid student throughout his course, and a high standing in his examination, while anticipated, is a fitting reward for his honesty and integrity to his work. The Guardian wishes him continued success.

THE Abegweit Athletic Club have hired the grounds of the C. A. A. A. for the season and are fitting up the dressing rooms, preparing the track and generally making the grounds a more attractive spot for the young men of the city. The lawn tennis courts are being prepared and a large number of young men have intimated that they will play tennis this summer. This move to make the game more generally popular in the city is a most commendable one and deserves encouragement.

STOCK NOTES.—The thoroughbred stallion Haphazard, imported and owned by John Richards, Esq., came to town yesterday's train and is at Mr. O'Halleron's stables, Great George Street. This fine horse represents the highest type of the thoroughbred, and is a horse of handsome conformation, with good size and substance, and in addition to this he has the distinction of being the fastest racer that ever trotted Canadian soil. His record mile in 1:41 at 3 years old was made on a somewhat slow track. He won at all distances from 5 furlongs to 1 1/2 miles. His winnings on the turf in three years amount to over \$30,000. He comes honestly by his racing propensities, his sire "Leontas" being one of the greatest racers the American turf ever produced—having never met defeat; his grand sire Billet won many of the great events on the English turf, and his great-grand sire Voltigeur won the English Derby, Doncaster St. Leger, and the Doncaster cup. His seed lines on his dam's side are equally strong.
