TREATING WOUNDS ON BATTLE FIELD

Every Canadian Will carry a Package of Lint.

OTTAWA, Oct. 26.—(Special.)—Seldom has an army corps gone to the front so well equipped from a life-saving standpoint as the Canadian contingent for the Transvaal. In addition to the protection against fatalities furnished by a well-equipped ambulance corp and skilled surgeons and nurses, each man will carry sewn to the lining of his coat a sealed packet containing simple yet effective means for treating wounds on the battle field. The packet in the use of which each soldier is instructed beforehand, is a sealed water proof packet containing aseptic dressing for binding about the wounds. Then comes a bundle of lint gauze of the best quality obtainable, and sufficient for the treatment for several serious wounds. Then there is a band of 4-1-2 yards of gauzy material for binding the wounds. On the outside of each packet is a card bearing the name and address of the owner. A similar card is sewed within the packet, together with full yet simple directions as to show how the bandages are to be used. Altogether the outfit is a most effective one for treating wounds on the battlefield, serving at once the purpose of preventing waste in hospital supplies, enabling wounded men to care for themselves until assistance arrives, and to readily identify men whose wounds have proved fatal. Dr. Neilsen has devoted special care to this matter, and has arranged to have 1,170 of these jackets taken with the contingent, so as to have a reserve store after providing one for each man.

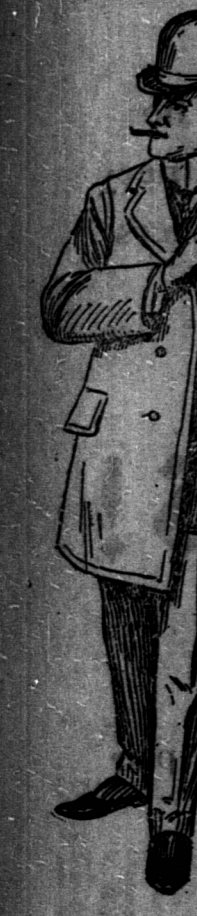
