NOTHING TO BE GAINED BY OBSTRUCTION.

Ottawa despatches intimate the intention of the very patriotic Opposition to prolong the debate on reciprocity, the voting of supply and the session of Parliament indefinitely and so preventing Sir Wilfrid Laurier from attending either the Imperial Conference or the King's coronation.

Probably they may think better of it and not carry out this imprudent and unpatriotic design. The Opposition leaders would have the country believe they are very patriotic and loyal to the King and the Empire.

It would seem desirable to most of the plain people that Canada should be represented both at the Coronation and the Conference by her greatest men.

Assuming it to be possible that the Conservative party could and would carry on a policy of obstruction at

such length and with such violence as to compel the Premier to remain in Ottawa, what would the party gain by such a course? They could hardly hope to gain favor either in Britain or in Canada, or fame or glory at home or abroad.

The obviously right thing to do is to stop talking, go to work and complete the public business and have Parliament prorogued. So much has already been said for and against reciprocity by the ablest speakers on both sides that further discussion, mainly from the back benches will be but a dry and fruitless thrashing out of old straw.

DUTY ON FARM IMPLEMENTS.

The Guardian has been asked to quote the present rates of duty on farm implements and the reduced rate under the reciprocity agreement. The Toronto Star of recent date contains the following table which answers the inquiry:

It will be noticed that in fourteen of the seventeen items the reduction is five points and in the remaining three items of farm wagons, reapers and mowers, 2 1/2 per cent. In addition to these reductions there is a new arrangement as to parts sent back to the United States for repair.

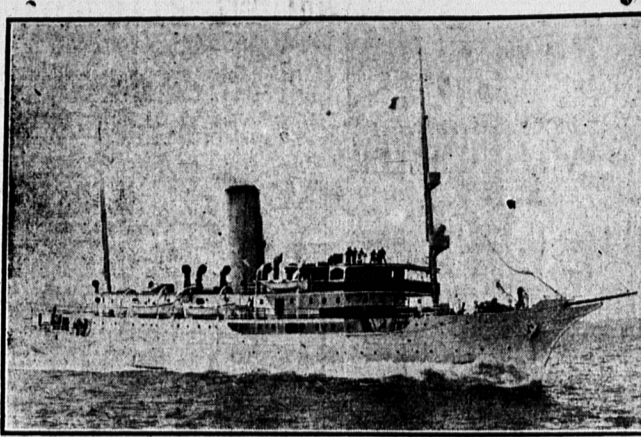
