A PLEA FOR FAIR TREATMENT.

We would like to see the Province retainer from Ottawa, The Patriot receive fair treatment from the Do-editor in the pay of the Ottawa minion, which it has not had from Government and proclaiming that w either of the political parties. All flesh," is it not time for an indepen the hard things he has said of The bent newspaper to speak out in the Guardian and its editor do not weigh interests of the people?

Hundreds of men who have rendered less service to the Liberal party than he have been given high offices while he has been overlooked. That is nothing to his discredit. The Guardian would gladly see him appointed to a good position, free from any compromising conditions.

What we complain of in this connection is that the parties having the control of patronage have not been fair to Mr Nash. The positions of editor of a party newspaper and employment at the same time in the civil service are entirely incompatible. The editor in the employ of a newspaper is compromised and discredited by being in the pay of the Government. Moreover, if he is looking to a permanent appointment, as he properly may be, it is most unfair to him and prejudicial to his future to be compelled to continue what will be construed as offensive partisanship while in Government pay.

Both parties have hitherto made such partisanship a ground of dismissal when they come into power. We do not want to see the editor of The Patriot so compromised in taking office that it must bring about his dismissal when a change of Government shall be made.

The proprietors of The Patriot should pay Mr Nash a salary upon which he can live, while he remains connected with the paper. It is not fair to him nor to the people to pay him public money to eke out an insufficient salary while he is engaged in partisan work and advocacy. So long as he is an editor he ought not to receive public money. Once appointed to an official position, he ought not to be in the pay of any newspaper. The present conditions ought to be terminated at once.

A partly paralled case is that of Premier Hazard, Attorney General of the Province, who is also agent of the Department of Justice at Ottawa. In our sharp controversies with the Dominion we regard it as especially unfortunate that the leader of the Provincial Government is in the pay of the Federal Government. For Premier Hazard himself we have the highest regard and respect, and we believe he would be as little influenced as almost any man we know of by his peculiar position. We greatly regret that he should continue to hold two employments which are in our opinion quite incompatible.

We have no desire to make too much of this, and only refer to it as one feature of an unfortunate situation for the Province. We are making slow progress if any in bringing our claims against the Dominion Government to a settlement. It is not strange that our progress is slow. With the Premier of the Province handicapped as he is by the

In that case our supposed claims against the federal Government are something worse than the demand for the pound of flesh! This is, we suppose intended to prepare the public mind for the abandonment of these claims.

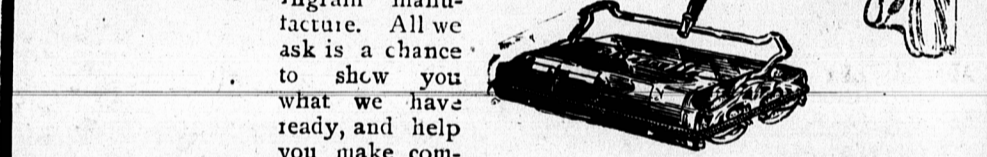

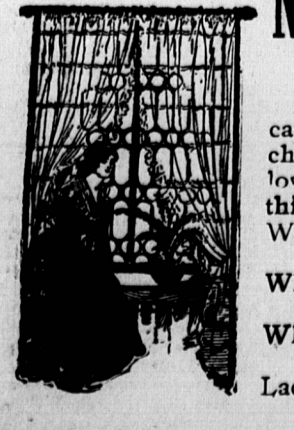
