Canadians in London

The Canadian High Commissioner's Office, in London, week by week.

During the past week 203 visitors called at the Canadian Office in Kinross House—134 of these obtained interviews and 36 registered.

The Prime Minister of Canada accompanied by Mr. Larkin and General Sir Pabon Ware, Director of the War Graves Commission, left for France yesterday and on reaching Boulogne motorcade round the Cemeteries at Terlinthun, where wreaths were deposited on the Cross of Sacrifice. The party were received by representatives of the French, civilian and military authorities and by about thirty of the Canadian members on the staff of the War Graves Commission. The Prime Minister and the Canadian High Commissioner then visited Etapes where of the 11,000 graves of British Soldiers 1,100 are those of Canadians.

They then proceeded to Paris where Mr. Larkin signed the Protocol of the International Air Navigation Commission on behalf of the Canadian Government.

The High Commissioner has been notified that in view of the adoption of Canada to the International Convention for the protection of industrial property, signed at Washington, in 1911, it will now be possible for all Canadian firms to obtain registration in Denmark of trade marks which they have registered in Canada, if such marks fulfil the general conditions laid down by Danish trade mark legislation.

The records kept by the High Commissioner's Office in London show that some 35,000 Canadian Store Cards have reached the United Kingdom since April last. The trade in Store Cards has had many difficulties to surmount, not the least being the very serious outbreaks of foot and mouth disease in Great Britain, in consequence of which the ports of both Glasgow and Bristol are closed for the landing of cattle. Through an arrangement made by the High Commissioner's Office with one of the leading Canadian firms of film distributors in London, the films produced by the Exhibits and Publicity Bureau of the Department of Trade and Commerce, Ottawa, illustrating Canadian industries, manufacturers and scenery, have been shown throughout the British Isles during the last few years. These films have attracted much attention and have gained a great deal

of publicity for Canada. An example of the many varied enterprises received by the High Commissioner for Canada is the request from a gentleman who wishes to organize an expedition to carry on fishing, trading and scientific work in the Bay district and who was anxious to set into touch with Captain Bernier concerning this matter.

The Canadian High Commissioner has often presided over the Christmas entertainment for poor children at the Guildhall organized by the Shattisbury Society (with which is incorporated the Ragged School Union) the funds for which are provided by friends of the Society in Hamilton, Ontario, and in British Columbia. These entertainments are much looked forward to by some of the poorest children in London.

This year the entertainment will take place at the Guildhall on December 28th, when the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress will preside, accompanied by the Sheriffs of London.

were before the big one in Halifax fell. That may be a political misfortune to Hon. Messrs. Fielding, E. M. MacDonald and the other thirteen of the group, but what was the "blunder" and who was it that blundered? Clearly the props were not strong enough, or numerous enough, or the wind was too strong. Really it was the strength of the wind that caused the "blunder." Other storms will come in winter and spring which will sweep over the entire province. Those who will be trying times for many weak, hollow and decaying trees in the Canadian Liberal grove.

Returns so far received from the British elections clearly indicate that the Conservative party will be considerably the strongest of the three contesting groups, with Labor holding the second place as in the late Parliament. It is to be noted that in the late House the official Opposition was made up of the Labor party, with Ramsay MacDonald as its leader. This raises the question, in case of the resignation or defeat of the Baldwin Government, upon whom would King George call to form a new Administration? According to precedent he would be expected to call upon the Leader of the Opposition, Ramsay MacDonald.

donald to form a Government, or upon subsequent defeat, would Mr. Asquith or Mr. Lloyd George be called upon. The situation would seem to be a very difficult one. It would appear to be almost impossible for the Labor party and the Liberal party to join and form a coalition government in view of the capital levy to which both Liberals and Conservatives are unalterably opposed, but to which the Labor party is strongly committed. Almost equally impossible would it be for Conservatives and Liberals to join their forces owing to their mutual antagonism in regard to protection and free trade. And yet "the King's Government must be carried on."

Premier Baldwin stood pledged to give effect to his Protection and Preference Policy if the electorate gave him a mandate to do so. This mandate has not been given him. Both in the new House and in the country there is a pronounced majority against protection, as is shown by the election. We cannot imagine Mr. Baldwin proposing a protective tariff measure in the new Parliament. To do so would be to court almost immediate defeat. His Government is already defeated in the electorate to accept the central and principal plank in its platform.

In Saturday's issue, however, intimating that he will meet Parliament, accept defeat at its hands and then retire gracefully. It counts for much that he still leads a strong party, the strongest of the three, and has fallen on good ground. The acceptance of a protective policy by the electorate cannot be long delayed. The Liberal defeat is so crushing as to be almost humiliating, the Labor party is strongly committed.
