Manuring Fruit Trees.

We are inclined to the opinion that the prevalent fear of injury to fruit trees from too heavy green manuring is exaggerated. We are told that the stuff ferments and sours the soil. What we want is a thorough decomposition of the green manure, and this fermentation is the beginning of the process. The more violent the fermentation the sooner is the decomposition completed, and when completed no harm results. We have piled green pea vines, weeds and grass around the trees, with just enough soil thrown on to keep the mulch in place, and this has rapidly decomposed under the influence of heat and moisture, and the result was thrifty and a heavy crop of sound fruit.—Farm and Ranch.
