1819 ODDFELLOWS NATAL DAY 1911

HAS WITNESS TO PROVE THAT SHELDON DID NOT INVEST MONEY

MONTREAL, April 25.—"If Sheldon can show that he invested every cent of money that was given him, the Crown's case will fall through," said Mr. J. B. Walsh, the Crown Prosecutor this morning.

"But," he added, "I scarcely think he can do that, for I have a witness who has not yet been called, who gave his money to Sheldon, or paid it into the office only a short time before he left town, and at a time which would make investment impossible."

"Will his brokers and bankers be called to show that he did not invest all his money?" Mr. Walsh was asked.

"I am not sure whether that will be necessary," replied the prosecuting attorney. "The case will be handled as any other was, but it is necessary will certainly be done."

The impression is growing stronger that Sheldon will not go before a jury. Mr. Pelletier, his lawyer, has practically stated this. Now comes the statement that the case will come up once more as soon as Judge Choquet returns. As His Honor will be back from Europe in about ten days the case may be heard much sooner than was expected.

The rumor to the effect that Mr. Pelletier was to be replaced as Sheldon's counsel was denied by Mr. Pelletier himself this morning. He stated that he was not giving up the case and that no change was contemplated as far as he knows.

Sheldon continues the most uninteresting prisoner in the jail, said Governor Vallee this morning. "That of course is a model prisoner. He loses all individuality when he passes into the grey stone building. This morning he heard the whimpers of Gervais who was whipped for his cell was on the next corridor. But with the others he was locked up at the time and saw nothing."

TORONTO, April 21.—The act restricting the sale of offensive weapons, passed at the last session of the Legislature, will go into force on Saturday next by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

HOT WORDY DUELS IN BRITISH HOUSE

LONDON, April 21.—The House of Commons sat until 3.25 o'clock this morning, a number of Opposition amendments to Clause Two of the Parliament Bill, restricting the powers of the House of Lords over measures other than money bills, being rejected by substantial majorities, for the most part after the application of closure.

The uncompromising attitude taken by Premier Asquith greatly pleased his followers. An acrimonious duel in personalities occurred at the close of the sitting between Earl Winterton, who was conspicuous for his noisy interruptions, and Home Secretary Churchill. The Chairman pointedly warned Earl Winterton and appealed to the members generally to preserve the decency and dignity of the House. The debate will be resumed Monday.

The amendments continue to pile up. Something like eighty pages of amendments to clause 2 are already handed in, but all will be relegated to the waste paper basket as soon as the Government leaders think that they have accorded the proposers sufficient rope. The Cabinet officially proclaims an intention to pass the bill as it stands.

Home Secretary Churchill yesterday refused even to consider a motion to limit the operation of clause 2 to three years. He declared that the Government would not accept any time limit of the period in which they should reform the Upper House. Premier Asquith, in a fighting speech, declared that the Government would accept no amendments which would exclude from the clause any class of legislation. The assumption underlying the bill, he said, was that the House of Commons, representing the people, had provided checks on the House of Lords. They were not taking away its veto, but were only limiting its duration and scope.

"The veto of the Crown is gone," exclaimed the Prime Minister. "It is as dead as Queen Anne. It has gone by disease; so ought the veto of the House of Lords to have gone."

When the House of Lords turned itself into a permanent partisan ally of one particular party, continued Mr. Asquith, it became necessary to deal with it by legislation. The Liberal party had received a mandate from the country for the bill and would use the machinery created by it in this Parliament to carry out the objects the party had at heart.

Mr. Balfour, leader of the Opposition, said that the claim that the House of Commons should be omnipotent in legislation was a "monstrous doctrine." It meant an absolute single chamber of government. He maintained that the electors did not know when they returned the Government that they were voting for Home Rule, the whole Constitution being sacrificed in a scandalous bargain between the Government and the Nationalists.
