Opinion Poll On Teen-Agers

Mothers with teen-age children are always hearing from their youngsters, "Everybody else can stay out late, why can't I?" And the opinion poll in the current Woman's Home Companion is devoted to just this problem—How Do You Deal With the Teens? Mothers can now know at least how the 2,000 Companion readers, who represent an accurate cross section of the magazine's reader homes, handle the question.

Ten o'clock is what most parents agree on for weekdays, 11:30 for Fridays and Saturdays—except that on week-ends only, the boys can be allowed an extra half-hour, this poll reveals. The opinion of the American woman seems to be that the boys need that extra half-hour to escort their ladies home and then gather under the street light to discuss the happenings of the evening. Unexpectedly, mothers in large cities as well as country towns seem to agree on this general time rule.

Pocket Money

On the problem, "How much pocket money (over and above school meals and expenses) do you think high school boys and girls should have per week?" the boys again get the break, but perhaps because the mothers take into consideration that the boy, at least at the soda fountain, usually pays. The answer here, both from reader-reporters with and without children, is that two dollars a week is a satisfactory allowance for boys. Girls should get one dollar, according to the results of the poll, from women who have children 12 to 18 years old; those who have no children would give girls more, but only up to a dollar and a half and still less than the boys.

Too Much Freedom

As to training in general of the modern child, 74 per cent. of the reader-reporters felt they were too leniently brought up rather than too strictly. Typical comments of American women polled was that "nowadays children are given too much freedom," "have too few restrictions and too few disciplined activities." Also a few groups
