A grand banquet and social, under the auspices of the Masons, will be held at Cape Traverse on the 28th.

The City Bye-election for one councillor, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of A. E. Arsenault held at Summerside yesterday, was hotly contested. There were 529 votes polled, of which Dr. McLellan received 292 and his opponent Dr. James McDonald received 230 giving Dr. McLellan a majority of 62 votes.

The Island Farmer reports that Mrs. Thomas McCaull, of Ellerslie, met with a somewhat serious accident last Monday. While going to the barn she slipped on a piece of ice falling backwards and striking her head with such force as to render her unconscious in which condition she remained for some hours. It was at first feared that her injuries were fatal but she is improving and is thought to be out of danger.

The dedication of a new chapel at Mt. Carmel will take place on Sunday next. This new chapel which has just been completed after years of hard work by the energetic pastor, Rev. P. P. Arsenault, ranks as one of the finest in this Province. The impressive ceremony of the dedication will be performed by his Lordship Bishop McDonald, assisted by the pastor and a number of other priests from different parts of the Island.
