INSPECTION OF MEATS AND MILK NEEDED.

We return to a subject which for years past has had frequent mention in these columns—the necessity for inspection of meats and other food products sold in the country market of this city.

Doubtless the great majority of those who bring food products to the market are honest and reliable. Unfortunately all are not so, and for that reason rigid inspection has become necessary.

As it is now there is a federal inspection of meats exported to other parts of the Dominion, but none required for meats sold within the Province. The result is that the consumer in other Provinces has such protection as is afforded in this way while the resident consumer has no protection.

These are some of the conditions which call for inspection such as is given in almost all cities of Canada, Charlottetown being the exception. For the protection of the consumer's pocket, for the protection of the public health, and for the punishment of dishonesty, inspection is urgently needed.

Beyond question unwholesome meats, poultry, fish, milk and eggs are from time to time sold in the city and purchasers are victimized, sometimes by buying what they cannot consume and in other cases what contains the germs of dangerous disease.

This we cannot have without inspection. The herds and the premises where they are kept, that supply the city with milk should be carefully inspected for diseased animals and for cleanliness and all slaughter-houses should be brought under strict regulations such as prevail in and about other cities of Canada.

RE-BALLOTING IN GERMANY.

In Germany, where a general election has just been held, a candidate to be successful, must have a majority of all the votes cast in his electoral division. Failing that, a re-ballot is held to determine which of the two highest candidates shall be declared elected.

Representation according to population does not prevail in Germany.

In re-balotting to decide between the two higher candidates there is often an entirely new alignment of parties. At the first ballot each party had fought for its own hand. At the second ballot there may be various combinations, with a view to elect or reject a particular candidate.

The Young Men's Christian Association is one of our indispensable institutions which from year to year has done excellent work in this city and which stands very high in the estimation of our best citizens.

Another point to be taken into account is the unequal distribution of voting power in proportion to population in the cities and rural districts. The Socialist vote is largely in the cities while the country people still vote with the aristocracy, who are the Conservative Agrarians.

Large credit is due to the Board of Directors and to the efficient and experienced Secretary, Mr. Reilly, whose heart is in his work, for the results achieved. There is need of more room and better accommodation for the ever-expanding work of the institution, a matter which must engage the earnest attention of the management in the future.

In the election of 1907 these latter elected 85 members with an average of 18,232 votes each. The Socialists secured only 43 seats with an average of 75,781 votes for each. Nearly half the German voters are in sympathy with the Socialist movement, but they have a poor chance to get representation in proportion to their numbers.

A strange attitude is that of Sir Rodolphe Forget, M.P., who at the September election was returned to the House of Commons for the two seats of Charlevoix and Montmorency. In all such cases the member having a double return is required to decide which seat he will hold and to resign the other, so that a new election may be held for the vacant seat.
