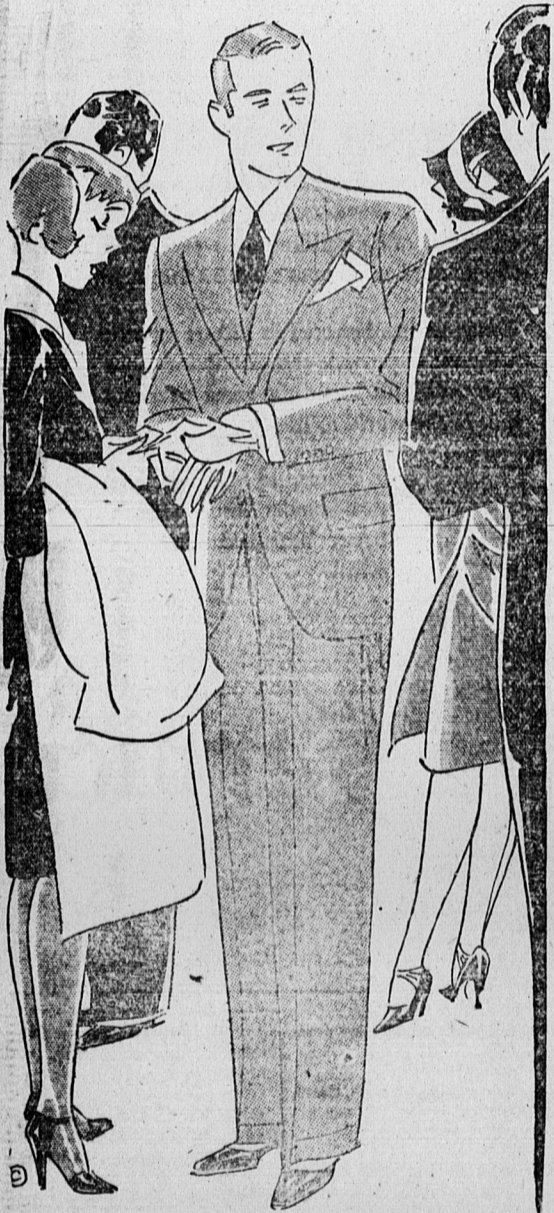

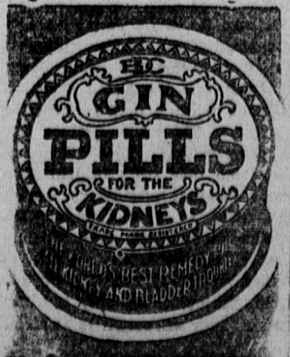

ila three times. He saw his first air-  
plane in 1923 and his first submarine
