HOW TO MAKE A RUBBER PLANT BRANCH.

The quickest way to induce a rubber plant to branch is to cut it down to within a foot or fifteen inches of the ground. New shoots, which will appear in a short time, will transform the stub into a shapely, round-headed tree. You can also check the growth of the old plant by pinching out the top bud. Another thing is to make a slanting cut in the stem so that when cut off the top will make a symmetrical plant. Put a small piece of wood or charcoal in the cut to keep it open. Over the cut lay some damp sphagnum moss; be sure that it is always damp, but do not let it become too wet or it will become sour. In a few weeks new roots will be seen protruding from the moss. When a mass of roots has been produced, cut off the stem below the moss and put the plant, moss and all, in a good potting soil. Put it in a shaded place for a few days until the roots have taken hold of the soil.

FASHIONS IN FUR FOR THIS SEASON.

Though mild weather is still with us women are already beginning to think of furs for winter wear, wondering just what is to be worn and what must be discarded. Every year furnishes a new fur fashion, and this year is no exception. Last year it was yellow fur; this year it is monkey. Sounds unattractive, doesn't it? In reality it is very pretty. The fur is long, black and silky, in fact looks a good deal like our old friend black fox. The hair is longer and more silky, and instead of sticking out like the fox lies almost flat. Undoubtedly you have seen this new peltry on many of the early autumn hats, for already it is being exploited largely by small milliners.

As a matter of fact there is nothing new about monkey fur. It is just another old fashion revived after many years of disuse. Ten or fifteen years ago it was very fashionable. Today it is back in favor again.

Besides monkey there are a variety of furs which will hold popular favor. Skunk is still a very smart peltry; blue and gray fox are both good; seal skin, civet, cat, black and white fox are all up in the list of favorites. Of the more expensive furs, chinchilla, ermine and sable are popular with those who can afford them. The skins that are decidedly dead as far as fashion is concerned, are mink yellow, and the natural red fox. The last two were a freak of last year's modes, and this year we may breathe a sigh of relief to be rid of them. Gone, too, are the furs dyed to match any gown—the blues, pinks, purples, greens and other kaleidoscopic peltries. This season we are promised sane and sensible furs, albeit rich in appearance, furs which will look chic, but no cause for caustic comment.

A note in fur fashions which is sure to bring joy to the heart of the woman who has only a small dress allowance is that while a good deal of fur is used as a trimming no large pieces are in vogue. For instance, from a last year's muff it will be quite possible to make a muff and a "chocker," the name given to the small round piece of fur which encircles the throat, ties tightly in a smart ribbon bow or ends in a big velvet flower. Muffs are smaller—in fact, many are so small that they hardly cover the hands. A small, round muff and a tiny "chocker" are considered the acme of smartness.
