Lumber shall be either spruce or hemlock. Plank may also be hardwood (white birch and poplar excepted). The tenderer shall state for which kind of lumber he is tendering.

Random lengths shall mean any length exceeding 10 feet. Minimum width of plank shall be seven inches.

Posts shall be either square or juniper. Small end dimension given is minimum that will be accepted.

Lumber shall be all square edged and sawn to the exact dimensions specified, and shall be perfectly sound and free from wane and shakes.

Parties tendering may tender for the whole or any portion thereof. Parties must state for what portion they are tendering. Tenders to be marked "TENDER FOR LUMBER."

All material shall be carefully inspected and measured before delivery is taken by the Department or payment made. Delivery of lumber shall be made on or before June 1st, 1945.

The Department does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.

Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Jan. — (AP) — Lagging buying interest, profit causing and a weaker cash corn causing grain futures prices to break sharply today but some of the losses were recovered when short covering brought on a minor rally just before the close.

WINNIPEG, Jan. — (CP) — Oats business transacted with the United States during the last three days were placed at 3,000,000 bushels following purchases today estimated at 200,000 bushels.

MONTREAL, Jan. — (CP) — Securities maintained the firm tone they have displayed since the beginning of the year today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. Industrials and papers rose to their highest level since 1937 in the last best since 1943. Golds were at their highest this year. A number of individual issues improved on their 1944 maximums and increases ran to more than 8 points.

NEW YORK, Jan. 4 — (AP) — The Stock Market, on balance, scored its sixth successive advance today and registered another peak for the past seven years although many leaders were stalled by profit taking.

TORONTO, Jan. 4 — (CP) — Prices registered on the upward slant in today's trading on the Toronto Exchange and all index groups recorded gains. The gold shares led with an advance of 7 1/2 and a gain of 28 was posted by the Western Oils. Base Metal Stocks had an insignificant gain.

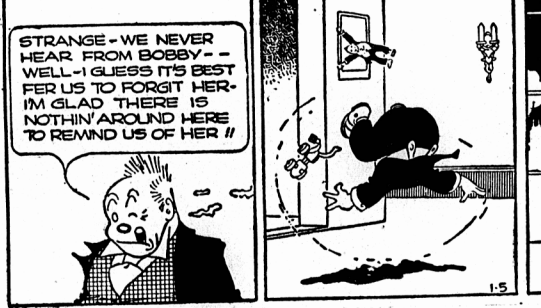
This War—Four Years Ago

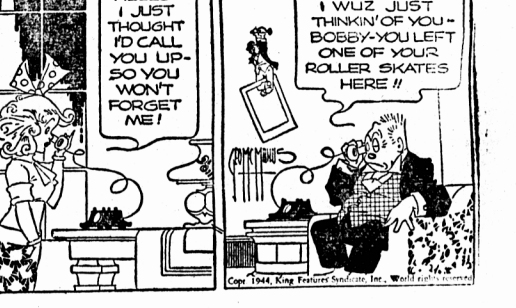
