SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

August 23.

THE WEDDING FEAST.

LESSON. Matthew xxii. 1-14.

GOLDEN TEXT. Luke xiii. 34.

“O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killeth the prophets, and stoneth them that are sent unto her! how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her own brood under her wings, and ye would not!”

THE TEACHING. The teaching of this parable specially emphasizes the privileges which are offered by the Kingdom of God. The whole purpose of God for men is figuratively set forth under this figure of a feast. The full realization of the Kingdom is that of joy and gladness and perfect satisfaction. At an earlier point in His ministry, as we have seen in a previous lesson this year, one man recognized the fact as he listened to the Master's rebuke of hosts and guests, and exclaimed, “Blessed is he that shall eat bread in the Kingdom of God.” In answer to him Jesus had uttered the parable of the Great Supper, which is so closely akin to this. In that as in this, the principal teaching had to do with the attitude of men to the invitation; but the conception must not be lost sight of. All we have said, it is that of the high privilege of being in the Kingdom, which is a Kingdom of righteousness, and therefore of peace and joy. The teaching of the lesson further emphasizes the nature of the answer of men to this offer of privilege. It is first that of refusal, the refusal of men who are blind to the glory and beauty of what is offered to them. This refusal is not accepted as final, and other servants are sent who describe more particularly the benefits which are offered. Men, still blind, make light of the invitation, and turn to their own interests, finding satisfaction in them, while others answer the bounty of the king by shamefully treating his messengers, and killing them. Such treatment is visited by swift judgment. The murderers are destroyed, and the city is burned. Yet once again the invitation goes forth, and this time those who are gathered constitute a mixed company of such as have come from unworthy and worthy motives. All this, falling from the lips of Christ, is surely an almost appalling revelation of His view of human nature. His final words, “Many are called but few chosen,” bring us back to the fact that the special emphasis of all His teaching at this time must

be laid upon the subject of service and responsibility. Although in this final paragraph He had spoken of the Kingdom under the figure which described its privileges rather than its responsibilities, it was spoken to against them was not only that they themselves did not enter in but that they prevented those who were entering in.

Whether these words refer to responsibility or privilege, standing as they do at the close of the parable, they constrain us to look back in order to see who were called, who were chosen. The call was general, open universal. Those were chosen who responded and fulfilled the conditions laid down. Those who were indifferent or hostile, those who accepted unworthily, were all finally rejected.

THE GOLDEN TEXT. The familiar words of the Golden Text are of great value in connection with this lesson, as they reveal to us the heart of the Lord. He was dealing in severe terms with the rulers of the city, under whose inspiration by evil submission thereto the city had rejected the messengers of God. His purpose had ever been that of gathering the children together and protecting them from all harm. The doom pronounced upon them was the result of their refusal of that purpose.
