**NEW ENGLAND
COTTON MILLS
TO CURTAIL**

Meeting Recently Held Decided to Reduce
Output 25 Per Cent From Now Till
March - 150,000 Employees
Affected

Boston, Dec. 28.—The Arkwright Club, which represents the cotton mill interests of New England, at a meeting here today formally voted to curtail production 25 per cent between now and March 1, in order to relieve conditions in the cloth markets of New York, Chicago, Boston and other large centres. It was stated several days ago that a committee previously appointed by the club to canvass the situation among the mills had found sufficient sentiment to ensure the success of the curtailment plan, and that the reduction of production was regarded as a certainty. The mills of New England employ about 185,000 operatives under normal conditions and it is expected that at least 150,000 will be affected by the short time. The curtailment agreement went into effect today, although numerous mills have been down since Tuesday. The agreement will affect a large majority of Fall River print cloth mills, the fine goods mills of New Bedford, the Amoskeag Corporation of Manchester, 13,000 hands and most of the other New Hampshire factories, the York Corporation of Saco, Maine, Pepperell mills, of Biddeford, the mills of Lewiston, Waterville, Brunswick and other Maine plants those in Lowell, employing 20,000, Lawrence, Holyoke, and Chicopee (Mass.) and mills controlled by large Rhode Island interests in that state and eastern Connecticut. The mills in Thornbury, Bondsville, Palmer Ware and Warren (Mass.) and Greenville and New Ipswich (N. H.) controlled by Bliss, Fabayn & Company of New York and Boston, adopted a short time policy a month ago, as did the Monadnock mills of Concord (N. H.). These and several other concerns will probably reach the end of their curtailment policy before the factories in the large centres.

More than eighty per cent of the spindles in New England is represented in the agreement. The majority of the mills represented will run four days a week during January and February, spending Thursday nights, thus including Saturday, a short work-day in the shut-down. Mills which have contracts falling for delivery during the winter are at liberty to reduce their production 25 per cent partially before March, and the remainder after that date. The method of reducing is left largely to the discretion of the manager. According to some of the officers of textile unions, the operatives prefer to work four days a week rather than be continuously idle for a period of nearly three weeks. The curtailment movement originated in New York commission houses, which feared a congestion of goods and falling prices in the spring if the mills continued to operate in full all winter.
