BECKER'S TRIAL GROWS IN INTEREST

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, May 19.—District Attorney Whitman today completed the case against Becker by placing on the stand two men whom he considered star witnesses, Charles E. Plitt, Jr., Becker's friend, a press agent and companion, and James Marshall, a colored youth who said he saw Becker and Jack Rose talking at Harlem, the conference declared by the Court of Appeals to have been the heart of the conspiracy to murder Rothensal. The gambler's widow and other persons also testified before the day ended.

Plitt swore Becker asked him while on the train from New York to the death house at Sing Sing, following his conviction on charge of murdering Rothensal, to kill Jack Rose; he also swore to taking messages to Rose both before and after Rothensal's murder. Rose was locked up charged with complicity in the crime as Becker warned Plitt to keep away

from Times Square on the night of the murder, also to establish alibi for himself and Becker should they be needed. Plitt has been considered one of Becker's best friends and consequently his testimony was a great surprise to the defence. The defence will open tomorrow. Becker will not be the first witness. Mrs. Becker will go on the stand expecting to contradict the testimony given by witnesses for the State who swore that Rose and Becker were friendly. Becker is expected to declare his relations with Rose merely as those of a police officer and a stool pigeon which Rose has admitted he was. It is expected thirty witnesses will be heard for Becker and that the case may be in the jury's hands Saturday night.

POPE'S BLESSING TO KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS


Louis Watson, State Deputy in Boston of the Knights of Columbus, has received a cablegram from His Eminence Cardinal O'Connell, conveying the blessing of Pope Pius X to the members of the Knights of Columbus in America. The cablegram was in response to one that had been sent to the Cardinal by the State Council which met in convention in Boston on Tuesday.

The sending of the cablegram, which conveyed words of loyalty and devotion to the Cardinal and through him to the Holy Father, from the members in this state, occurred at a most appropriate time it would appear. According to reports from Rome Cardinal O'Connell reached Rome on Tuesday evening and the following day he was received in audience by the Pope.

The cablegram from the state Council here was in the hands of Cardinal O'Connell early on Wednesday morning, as is assured by the reply now received.

SENATE MAY AMEND THE BILL

WASHINGTON, May 15.—Although many Senators are yet to speak on the Bill to repeal the exemption clause of the Panama Canal Act, Senator Kern, the majority leader, was hopeful last night that the debate would close in another week, and that a vote might be taken on May 25.

Before the Bill is voted upon, the many amendments which will be offered will have to be disposed of. It is generally believed the Bill cannot be passed exactly as it came from the House. The Senators who have led the repeal fight are expected to concentrate their efforts on the amendment offered by Senator Simmons and adopted by the Inter-Oceanic Canals Committee, which declares the United States, in repealing the exemption clause, waives no rights over the Canal.
