SPRING FLOORING IS EASILY REMEDIED

Excessively springy floors do not have to be tolerated by the home owner, for this condition can frequently be corrected without great cost. The floor should be examined by a competent carpenter. One cause of floors springing when walked upon may be floor joists that are too small or too widely spaced. Floors that are not properly braced with bridging usually have too much resilience; however, all wood floors have a certain amount of spring.

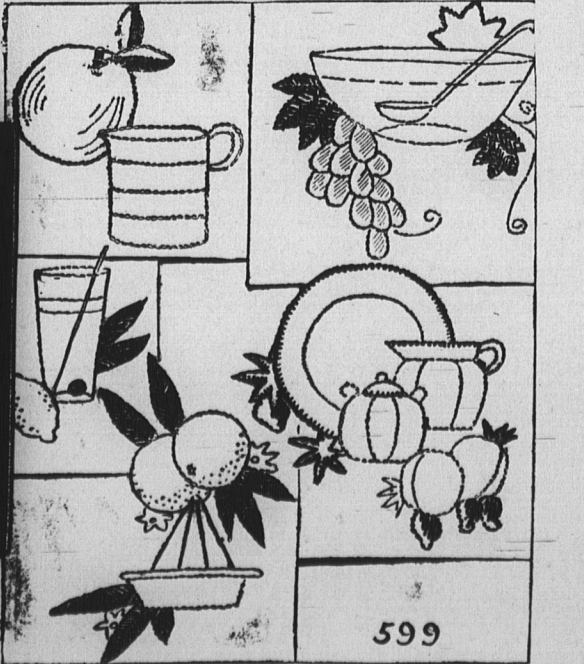
LEMON MERINGUE TARTS

3 tablespoons flour
1-2 cup sugar
1-2 tablespoons cornstarch
1-4 cups boiling water
1 egg, separated
Method: Mix together the flour and cornstarch and stir to a smooth paste with the cold water. Add the sugar to the boiling water and bring to a boil again, then gradually add the flour and cornstarch paste, stirring constantly. Stir and cook over low heat for about 15 minutes. Beat the egg yolk slightly and add part of the hot mixture to it. Mix well, and then return to the remainder of the sugar and starch mixture. Return to the heat, and continue cooking until the egg yolk is thickened. Remove from the fire and add the lemon rind, lemon juice, butter and salt and mix well. Pour into baked tart shells and cover with a meringue. Bake the meringue by beating the egg white until stiff, but not dry, and then beating in the sugar. Pile onto the meringue filling and brown in a moderately slow oven (325 deg. F) for about 12 to 15 minutes.

1 cup milk
Salt and pepper
3-4 teaspoon minced onion
1-2 cup butter
3 cups chopped, cooked potatoes.
Method: Melt the butter, blend in the flour, add the milk gradually, and cook until the sauce is thickened, stirring occasionally. Season with salt and pepper, and the minced onion. Now add the potatoes, and mix well. Turn into custard cups that have been buttered. Place 1-2 teaspoon melted butter on top of each and bake in a fairly hot oven (325 deg. F) for about 30 minutes. This can be done while glazing your ham.

BOILED SUGAR SPONGE CAKE

1 cup sugar
1-2 cup water
1 cup flour
1-2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 teaspoon salt
6 eggs, separated
1-2 teaspoon vanilla
1-2 teaspoon almond extract
Method: Beat egg whites until stiff, add cream of tartar and salt. Beat egg yolks until light, add 1/2 cup sugar and 1/2 cup vanilla. Beat sugar and water to the "third stage." 217 F. Add to stiffly beaten egg whites in thin stream, beating all the time. It is being added. The time it is being added. Carefully fold the sifted dry ingredients into the egg white mixture. Lastly, fold in the vanilla. Bake in a slightly fluted tube pan and bake at 300 F. for 1 hour and 10 to 15 minutes. Invert to cool.

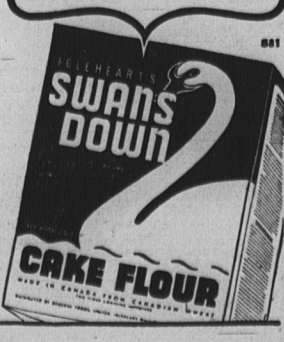

SEVENTH COMMANDMENT IS STILL THE LAW OF MORALITY

The Price You Pay For Breaking The Law Of Civilization Is High, And It Goes On To The End Of Your Days

Dear Dorothy Dix—I would like your opinion on a question which I feel troubles many girls today. Should a boy and girl who are in love with each other and who plan to marry have pre-marital relations? I have always felt that this was wrong, but my girl friend, who has gone with many different boys of all types, says boys all feel that if a girl loves a fellow she should give in to his desires. My friend thinks this makes for a happy marriage. This makes me wonder if a girl who goes with a boy steady and intends to marry him is right in living with him as his wife before marriage.
