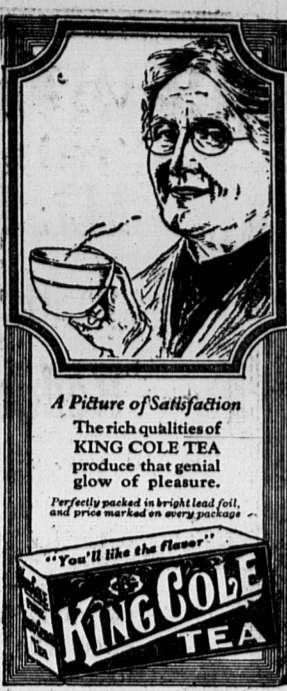

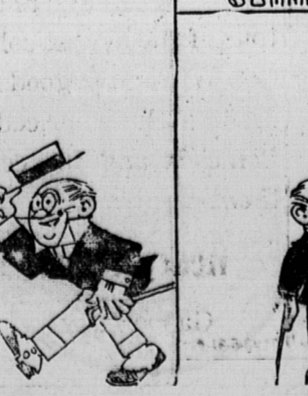

U. S. Reduces European Representation

(Special to The Guardian.) COBLENTZ, June 2.—The resignation of Pierpont B. Noyes, American delegate on the Rhine-Rand Commission, and the withdrawal of America from that body has been consummated, was in pursuance of a policy by the State Department in Washington which seeks a reduction of American representation in Europe, according to a statement made by Mr. Noyes today. General Henry T. Allen has received instructions to establish direct relations with the Allied Commissioner for all necessary purposes. Relief work will be continued despite the withdrawal of the Americans. At present 7,000 needy children are being fed daily.
