THE CZAR AND PEACE.

The serious illness of the Czar of Russia gives rise to concern as to what might happen in China in the event of his death. By pretty general consent the youthful Czar has been credited with a desire for peace for the present and for some years in the future. His father and grandfather were in the main peacefully disposed autocrats, and it is therefore easy to believe that Nicholas II has inherited a like disposition.

At the same time there are those who suspect that it is peace for the present rather than as a permanency, which the Czar has had most at heart. Peace is almost a necessity for Russia until the great Siberian Railway is completed, the mineral riches of Siberia opened up and developed and her more recent acquisitions in Central Asia are organised and consolidated as a part of the Empire.

Probably the reading public in English-speaking countries do not sufficiently realize the fact that in Russia there is a war party and a peace party. The young Czar has so far thrown his influence with the latter, and greatly increased its strength in Russia. At the same time the war party has been strong enough to secure the maintenance and increase of the vast armies of the Empire, and the rapid building of a great fleet such as was not dreamed of in a past generation.

The Czar has held the balance between war and peace and so far peace has prevailed. Were he now suddenly removed much would depend upon the disposition of his successor on the throne. It is here that doubt and concern arise, and the friends of peace throughout the world will rest easier should Providence order the recovery of the now afflicted Czar.

It turns out that three Conservative candidates who received majorities in the late Dominion elections in Ontario, had put up their election deposits by certified cheques, instead of bank-notes, or Dominion notes as required by law. Objection is taken that the law was not complied with, but where the cheques were accepted and the receipt of the returning officer given, that ought to end the matter.
