**HIGHWAYS TAKE HEAVY TOLL IN UNITED KINGDOM**  
 Some interesting figures have been prepared with regard to fatalities and injuries to person in the United Kingdom as between the railways and highways, states an operating official of the Canadian National Railways. The fatalities as regards trains last year were the lowest for thirty years, being one in some 262,000,000 passengers carried. The highway statistics, however, tell an entirely different story for last year 7,202 people were killed on the roads and 261,328 injured. The figures are from the report of the Chief Inspecting Officer of the Ministry of Transport on Railway Accidents for the United Kingdom.
